Man sought by police arrested in Crawford County

A suspect who was allegedly involved in a Sept. 11 altercation involving a knife in Fort Scott has been apprehended.

On Thursday, Nicholas Howard Juarez, 41, was taken into custody by law enforcement in Crawford County, according to a Fort Scott Police Department news release issued Thursday.

The release states the FSPD sends its apprecia-

tion to the Bourbon County Sheriff’s Office, Crawford County Sheriff’s Office, Kansas Bureau of Investigation, Kansas Highway Patrol and the United States Marshals Service for their assistance in the apprehension of Juarez.

All individuals are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law, the release states.

According to the BCSO arrest report, Juarez was arrested at 1:55 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 19 and held for the BCSO on three Bourbon

County warrants for failure to appear. Juarez’ bond has been set at \$30,000.

According to a Sept. 11 news release, about 2:53 a.m. Sept. 11, the FSPD was dispatched to a residence in the 1800 block of Charles Street in Fort Scott. Upon arrival at that location, FSPD officers learned that an altercation had taken place between a 16-year-old male and a 41-year-old male identified as Nicholas Howard Juarez. Officers were advised the altercation had taken place at a resi-

dence in the 100 block of South Margrave Street in Fort Scott. During the altercation, the juvenile male sustained a laceration from a knife utilized by Juarez. The juvenile’s injury was not considered life threatening at the time.

Juarez was believed to have left the scene on foot and had not been located as of Sept. 11. At the time, the FSPD urged the public to contact police or call 911 with information concerning the incident or Juarez’ whereabouts.
