Supreme Court Nominating Commission to meet by videoconference

TOPEKA—The Supreme Court Nominating Commission will meet by videoconference at 8 a.m. Monday, April 7, to discuss the procedure it will follow to seek nominations to fill a vacancy created when Justice Evelyn Wilson resigns July 4.

Nominating commission

The Supreme Court Nominating Commission has nine members. There is one lawyer and one nonlawyer from each of the state’s four congressional districts, plus one lawyer who serves as chairperson.

Nonlawyers are appointed by the governor. Lawyers are elected by other lawyers within their congressional districts. The chairperson is elected by lawyers statewide.

Merit-based selection process

Justices are appointed to the Supreme Court through a merit-based nomination process Kansas voters added to the Kansas Constitution in 1958. The process involves the Supreme Court Nominating Commission, which reviews nominees, and the governor, who makes the appointments.

When there is a vacancy on the bench, the Supreme Court Nominating Commission reviews applications and conducts public interviews of nominees. The commission narrows the nominee pool to three names that it sends to the governor. The governor chooses one nominee to appoint.

Eligibility requirements

A nominee must be:

- at least 30 years old; and
- a lawyer admitted to practice in Kansas and engaged in the practice of law for at least 10 years, whether as a lawyer, judge, or full-time teacher at an accredited law school.

Selection criteria

When the Supreme Court Nominating Commission reviews nominees for justice, they look at the person’s

- legal and judicial experience;
- educational background;
- character and ethics;
- temperament;
- service to the community;
- impartiality; and
- respect of colleagues.

Judicial conduct

Justices must follow the law and not be influenced by politics, special interest groups, public opinion, or their own personal beliefs.

Justices demonstrate their accountability by following a Code of Judicial Conduct that establishes standards of ethical behavior. They also take an oath of office that includes swearing to support, protect, and defend the U.S. Constitution and Kansas Constitution.

Retention elections

After a new justice serves one year on the court, he or she must stand for a retention vote in the next general election to remain in the position. If retained, the justice serves a six-year term.

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**RESOLUTION NO. 2025-07
A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE COMMERCIAL SOLAR OR WIND ENERGY PROJECT REGULATIONS FOR SUMNER COUNTY, KANSAS**

WHEREAS, on August 7, 2007, the Board of County Commissioners approved Sumner County Resolution No. 2007-26, effective August 9, 2007, providing for the adoption of Commercial Solar or Wind Energy Project Regulations, including being administered, any amendments thereto, appeals, and variances, all by Sumner County Commissioners, as per the recommendations by the Sumner County Planning Commission, with oversight and enforcement of the Regulations to the Sumner County Planning & Zoning Office;

WHEREAS, the Sumner County Board of County Commissioners find it necessary to amend/add to such Commercial Solar or Wind Energy Project Regulations, in order to keep up with changing technology and trends;

WHEREAS, the enactment of the this resolution shall amend/supersede any prior resolutions in reference to the specific stated regulations below.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SUMNER COUNTY, KANSAS THAT:

AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE IV B:

ACTION SECTION PARA
Change 6 10

As Reads: The maximum height of the solar panels shall not exceed 30 feet measured from the elevation of the ground surface at the base of the solar panel to the highest point/full tilt of the solar panel when vertical to the ground. The minimum distance for m the bottom of the solar panels in full tilt mode, down to the ground, shall be 10 feet.

Change to: The maximum height of the solar panels shall not exceed 20 feet measured from the elevations of the ground surface at the base of the solar panel to the highest point/full tilt of the solar panel when vertical to the ground.

SECTION 1: The amendments to the Commercial Solar or Wind Energy Project Regulations shall constitute the basis for determination of land development procedures within the Zoning Jurisdiction of Sumner County, Kansas.

SECTION 2: Therefore, this Resolution shall take effect upon publication one (1) time in the Official County Newspaper.
