(Continued from Page 1) is awarded, the city will receive \$650,000 for the depot restorations. In governing body comments, Councilor Sharon Haun thanked the city crews for diligent work in removing the many downed and stacked tree limbs after the recent storms. Administrator Jones added that because of the storm the city crews had less time to prepare the town and cemeteries for Memorial Day. He said the city crews mowed and weed-eated Greenwood Cemetery in two days, a remarkable feat. He also said that the city will be ordering about 20 new flags to replace those that were faded or torn. No disrespect was intended by displaying a flag that should be retired. The city will be working with volunteers to remedy the situation.

Councilor Denise Hartman commented on the successful Unbound Gravel bike race going through the city last weekend. Administrator Jones said that the city would see what type of "bump" sales tax received during the weekend when the report comes in 1 1/2 - 2 months. There were some issues that need to be discussed with organizers to improve the race in future years. The few issues that arose could have been prevented with better communication between the race organization and city leadership.

The meeting was adjourned. The next city council meeting will be at 5:30 p.m., Tuesday, June 18, at City Hall.

1981 The first cases of AIDS are reported

Turn To Turkey For Meals

Turkey does not garner much attention outside of Thanksgiving or other holidays when a roasted turkey is the centerpiece of a large family meal. However, turkey is a lean, tasty and versatile protein source that can be utilized in many meals. Individuals interested in reducing the fat and calorie content of some of their favorite dishes can opt for turkey over red meat.



This is the case for "Turkey Burgers" from "The New Trailside Cookbook" (Firefly) by Kevin Callan and Margaret Howard. Turkey substitutes for ground beef in juicy burgers that can be cooked on the trail or in the backyard.

Turkey Burgers Makes 4 patties 1 pound lean ground turkey (or chicken) 1/3 cup panko crumbs or dried bread crumbs 1 egg, beaten 1/4 cup sour cream or plain yogurt 2 green onions, chopped 1 teaspoon each dried thyme and oregano 1/2 teaspoon each salt and freshly ground pepper 4 whole wheat buns, halved

In a bowl, combine chicken, crumbs, egg, sour cream, onions, thyme, oregano, salt, and pepper. Gently form into four evenly shaped patties. Wrap each patty in plastic wrap or foil to keep separated. Refrigerate or freeze until ready to use. When ready to enjoy, cook burgers 6 minutes per side and serve on toasted whole wheat buns.
