The City of Eureka will hold a public hearing on the October 17, 2024, at 6:30PM at Memorial Hall, 309 N. Oak Street, Eureka, Kansas 67045 for the purpose of considering an application to be submitted to the Kansas Department of Commerce for Small Cities Community Development Block Grant funds under the Community Facilities category. A specific project to be discussed is rehabilitation of Memorial Hall, located at 309 N. Oak Street, Eureka, Kansas. The project scope includes installation of a radon mitigation system and restoration of 907 square feet of windows on the east, west, and south facades by removing, cleaning, repairing, and applying a powder coat finish to the existing metal frames. New Low-E coated, single-pane glass would be installed, and repairs would be made to the walls and finishes adjacent to the window systems. The estimated project cost is \$368,157.00, with the grant request for \$282,867.00 of the project cost and a local match of \$85,290.00 from City funds. Other project proposals introduced at the public hearing will be considered. Oral and written comments will be recorded and become a part of the City of Eureka CDBG Citizen Participation Plan. The City of Eureka will hold a public hearing on Thursday, October 17, 2024, at 6:00PM at Memorial Hall, 309 N. Oak Street, Eureka, Kansas 67045, for the purpose of considering an application to be submitted to the Kansas Department of Commerce for Small Cities Community Development Block Grant funds under the Neighborhood Development category. A specific project to be discussed is substantial housing rehabilitation of approximately 9 (nine) houses occupied by qualifying low-to-moderate-income families, approximately 2 (two) of which will be rental units, 7 (seven) of which will be owner occupied, and the demolition of approximately 1 (one) vacant dilapidated residential structure within a target area bounded by W. 3rd Street to the North, W. River Street to the South, S. Poplar Street to the West, and N. Oak Street to the East. This project will include street reconstruction of approximately 740 linear feet of 1st Street, from Poplar to Sycamore, to address identified drainage concerns contributing to the degraded pavement condition. The estimated project cost is \$600,842.00, with the grant request for \$416,000.00 of the project cost and a local match of \$184,842.00 from the City of Eureka, Landlord Contributions, and the Kansas Weatherization Program. Other project proposals introduced at the public hearing will be considered. Oral and written comments will be recorded and become a part of the City of Eureka CDBG Citizen Participation Plan.
