City Commission hears public opinion on \$17 M. community center project

More than 50 Concordia residents appeared at City Hall on Wednesday evening, for a public hearing regarding a proposed \$17 million community center for the town.

Concordia City Mayor Amy Jackson opened the meeting with a few statements and directed the large audience on acceptable conduct during the hearing. She also provided the purpose for the hearing, which is part of the process to apply for a \$2.5 million Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Blueprint to Build program.

After her introduction, Jackson first

invited parks and recreation director Chris Atkins to speak at the podium for some foundational information.

"We started this process about three years ago, and our objectives have been the same. Support wellness and community, provide a high quality of life for residents and to promote social connection through this facility," Atkins said.

According to Atkins and other city staff, the \$17 million facility would have three major funding sources — costshare grant programs, private donations and a United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Community Facilities

Police continue investigating alleged attempted murder

Late Sunday evening, Aug. 17, Concordia Police Department (CPD) officers responded to the 300 block of East First Street for a report of an adult male with a gunshot wound to the abdomen.

According to a press release from CPD Chief Brent Gering, officers responded to this call at 11:04 p.m. On the scene, they found the adult male actively bleeding, and Concordia Fire Department (CFD) assisted in rendering life-saving aid at the

CPD officers secured the scene, interviewed witnesses and gathered investigative information. According to the press release, officers identified individuals

connected to this incident, and detained

them for questioning.

Officers continued working through the night to identify a primary suspect. Search warrants were then executed at the scene of the shooting and at a secondary location, and CPD officers continue working with outside agencies in an effort to locate and apprehend the suspect.

CPD officers have forwarded charges for first-degree attempted murder and two counts of aggravated robbery to the Cloud County Attorney. All involved individuals are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.
