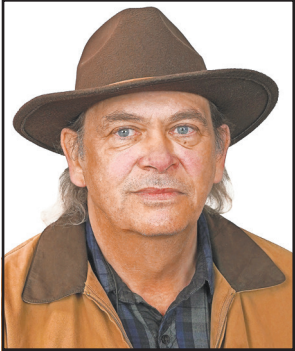

Medicaid’s 60th anniversary a call for health care for all

This week marks 60 years since the signing of Medicaid into law, and it’s a moment to reflect, celebrate, and recommit to the work toward health care access for

every Kansan.
On July 30, 1965, President Lyndon B. Johnson signed Medicaid and Medicare into law as part of the Social Security Amendments. At the ceremony, former president Harry Truman and his wife Bess received the first Medicare insurance cards.

In that moment, our country took a historic step toward ensuring that health care was more accessible for all citizens.
Since then, Medicaid has transformed health care in America by providing coverage to millions of children, seniors, people with disabilities, and low-income families. It’s helped families stay financially stable, supported rural hospitals and clinics, and given people access to preventive care and life-saving treatment.
