MANHATTAN, Kan. – With warmer days in the near-term forecast, many Kansans are eager to get back to gardening. Kansas State Unihorticulture versity expert Cynthia Domenghini said early work can begin on vegetables like peas and lettuce.

"If you are tired of winter and hunger for spring, try planting peas as soon as the soil dries and the temperature reaches 40 degrees Fahren-Domenghini said.

There are many varieties to choose from in Kansas. Domenghini suggests early maturing varieties with resistance to powdery

maturing "Early types allow us to harvest a crop before the hot weather arrives and stops produc-Domenghini said. She added that plant size should be a consideration when selecting varieties.
