USD 112 discusses building for Holyrood

LAFLIN — The Central Plains USD 112 Board of Education held a special meeting to discuss the acquisition of a modular building for Central Plains Elementary School at 6 p.m. Sept. 23 in the Central Plains Jr./Sr. High School cafeteria. The meeting was requested at the regular Sept. 8 meeting to inform board members of the bids and expected expenses so they could decide on the expenditure and still allow the building to be on track to be in place

After discussion on layouts, groundwork and bids, the board entertained two motions.

"At this point in time, I would entertain a

motion to go forward with a box modular bid for the addition for the Central Plains Elementary School," **Board President** Tamara Dody said.

The motion passed 7-0.

"From the discussion, I believe I would entertain a motion to accept a motion for Option No. 2 for the three-year financing with the option for early payoff," Dody said.

A motion was made, and with no further discussion, it was approved

"That will give us what we need to move forward and get the developmental stage of that done," Superintendent Bobby Murphy said. "We'll come back at the October board meeting with Option No. 2. We'll have the interest rate percentage on there as well, and have what it will look like with a couple of options and what the price would be with an early payoff as well, and at that time, we can make a decision on what we want to put down, if we want to put something down."

While the rates on the building will be available for the board to make a decision on at the October meeting, all bids on groundwork and other incidentals will follow.

'There is no way I'll have all the bids on the prework to you guys by October," Murphy said. "I would hope that by November I would have all the bids to you guys by then, because each one of them will have to be a separate motion.

'My hope is by the first of November, we have all those laid out for you guys so we'll know what direction we are going, and that gives us December, January, February, March. We have the timeline in there to try and get those things done."

Murphy said if this option is approved at the November meeting, the modular building should be in place by the end of June.

"I think on the timeline he gave us, we should be able to hit it the end of June for delivery and hookup. So, we'll have the whole month of July and maybe a little bit of August to get wiring run, things put togeth-

The next meeting of the USD 112 school board will be at 6 p.m. Oct. 13 in the CPJSHS cafeteria, where, on the agenda, will be the final discussion on the acquisition of a modular building for the school.

Notice is hereby given to the qualified electors of Ellsworth County, Kansas (the "County") that a special question election has been called and will be held on November 4, 2025, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the County the following proposition:

Shall the following be adopted?

Shall Ellsworth County, Kansas, be authorized to: (1) impose a one-quarter percent (0.25%) retailers' sales tax (the "Sales Tax") for the purpose of financing costs to construct, furnish and equip (a) law enforcement center improvements, including secure walkway and access from the jail to the courthouse, new vehicular sallyport and booking area, dispatch improvements, and new generators, and (b) courthouse improvements, including HVAC improvements, relocation of register of deeds space, and clerk space improvements, and to make all other related improvements (the "Project"), with the County retaining the entirety of the Sales Tax revenue for such purposes, and with collection of such Sales Tax to commence on April 1, 2026, or as soon thereafter as permitted by law, and to expire upon the payment of all costs incurred in the financing of the Project (including the retirement of any bonds issued and payable from such sales tax); and (2) issue sales tax/general obligation bonds (the "Bonds") in an amount not to exceed \$3,200,000 to pay the costs of the Project, related interest costs during construction and issuance costs; provided that prior to such bond issuance the County receives a comprehensive feasibility study that indicates the revenues received from the Sales Tax will be sufficient to retire the Bonds without the necessity of levying any ad valorem taxation; all pursuant to the authority of K.S.A. 12-187 et seq., as amended?
