MANHATTAN, Kan. April 28, 2025 - For the week ending April 27, 2025, there were 4.2 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 8% very short, 22% short, 59% adequate, and 11% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 12% very short, 28% short, 54% adequate, and 6% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 4% very poor, 13% poor, 36% fair, 40% good, and 7% excellent. Winter wheat jointed was 78%, near 82% last year, but ahead of 66% for the fiveyear average. Headed was 19%, behind 29% last year, but ahead of 10% average.

Corn planted was 39%, near 37% last year, and ahead of 29% average. Emerged was 11%, near 15% last year and 8% average.

Soybeans planted was 13%, near 11% last year, and ahead of 7% average.

Sorghum planted was 3%, near 2% last year and 1% average. Data for this news release were provided at the county level by USDA Farm Service Agency,

KSU Extension Service, and other reporters across the State.
