The Century Farm program honors Farm Bureau members who own farms of at least 80 acres within the same family for 100 years or more. The Sesquicentennial Farm recog-

"Kansas farmers and ranchers have a lot to be proud of," Joe Newland, Kansas Farm Bureau president, says. "One thing we take pride in is our value in the traditions and strong family ties through generations of rural living. Kansas Farm Bureau is honored to celebrate those through the Century Farm and Sesquicentennial Farms programs." The deadline for consideration to be part of the 2025 programs is May 15. Kansas Farm Bureau has recognized 3,210 Century Farms and 132 Sesquicentennial Farms since their inception.
