Resurfacing Work to Start on U.S. 24 in Thomas County

The Kansas Department of Transportation will begin a resurfacing project on a portion of U.S. 24 in Thomas County the week of July 28.

Project work will involve milling and overlay on 8.5 miles of the highway starting at the east city limits of Colby and ending just east of the U.S. 83 intersection. Traffic will be reduced to one lane through the areas where crews are actively working and directed by flaggers and a pilot car. Motorists should plan for delays of 15 minutes or less during daylight hours.

Project work is expected to be completed in mid-September, conditions permitting.

West Regional scores info...first off, you have to be 1 of the top 4 teams with the best record in your league to advance to your regional tournament. Hoxie was the 2nd seed out of the Wildcat League. There were 6 teams in the Wildcat League (Atwood, Hoxie, Colby, Goodland, Oberlin, and Oakley). Hoxie's only loss in the regular season was to Atwood on the road and at home. Hoxie beat Colby, Goodland, Oberlin, and Oakley in all regular season games on the road and at home.

The West Regional Tournament began last Monday, July 14, with Colby being the host site. The top 4 teams in the Wildcat League that advanced to the West Regional Tournament were: Atwood, Hoxie, Colby, and Goodland. The top 4 Wildcat League teams play the top 4 teams from the Jayhawk League. Those 4 Jayhawk League teams this year were: Norton, Ellis, Victoria, and Plainville.

Hoxie's first Regional game was on Tuesday, July 15. They played the Victoria Eagles K18 team with Hoxie winning in the 5th inning with a run rule score of 9-1. Hoxie then played Norton in the Regional tournament on Saturday, July 19, with Hoxie winning in the 7th inning, 5-3. Hoxie then played Atwood for the Regional Championship, beginning the game on Saturday, July 19, but having to postpone the game at the bottom of the 3rd inning due to the weather. They finished the game on Sunday by moving it to Hoxie's ballfield that wasn't as wet as Colby's field. Hoxie beat Atwood this time and became the West Regional Champions with a run rule win in the 4th inning score of 11-1!!!
