January 6, 2025

The Nuckolls County Board of Commissioners met Monday, January 6, 2025, in the Board Meeting Room at the Courthouse, Nelson, Nebraska, per recess of December 16, 2024. Grove, Zikmund and Mussmann present for the meeting. The agenda of said meeting was remitted to board members in advance of the meeting and is posted in the County Clerk's office and on the County Website. Chairman Zikmund announced the "Open Meetings Act Law" as posted in the Commissioners Board Meeting Room and handouts are available.
