Lincoln County FINAL PERFORMANCE PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE CDBG COVID Resiliency (CVR) Project

The county of Lincoln County will hold a final performance public hearing on August 4, 2025 at 9:30 am, at the Lincoln County Courthouse Commission Room at 216 E. Lincoln Ave, Lincoln, Kansas, for the purpose of evaluating the performance of Grant No. 23-CVR-007 which was proposed to provide grants to local for-profit businesses that employ at least 51% low-to-moderate income fulltime employees, prioritizing businesses that have a majority ownership by a socially or economically disadvantaged person(s) as defined in 15 CFR 1400.4. These funds are to be used for upgrades allowing the businesses to remain open and preventing future closures due to community illnesses and health emergencies. Those projects include but may not be limited to technology, hardware, and software, including infrastructure, devices and applications, eCommerce updates, including online inventory management and website enhancements, professional development and training for business enhancements, and other updates that can be directly related to resiliency

The project as completed included, funding of 3 for-profit businesses which met the 51% low-to-moderate income full-time employee criteria. Funds were utilized for such items as: HVAC upgrade, radon mitigation system, essential care equipment, website development, website maintenance fee, and computer equipment. Additional project item included grant administration.

The total project cost was \$76,595.45 with \$76,595.45 in CDBG funds utilized. This grant was funded, all or in part, from the Kansas Department of Commerce, Small Cities Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds. All aspects of the grant will be discussed and oral and written comments will be recorded and become a part of the county of Lincoln County CDBG Citizen Participation Plan. Reasonable accommodations will be made available to persons with disabilities. Requests for accommodations should be submitted to the Lincoln County Clerk by August 1, 2025.

ORDINANCE NO. 760

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 698 OF THE CITY APPROVING THE LINCOLN VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS ("VFW") POST 7928 STREET DANCE COMMUNITY EVENT AS AN ADDITIONAL SPECIAL EVENT WITHIN THE CITY; APPROVING THE LOCATION THEREOF; REQUIRING A TEMPORARY PERMIT FROM THE CITY FOR THE SALE AND CONSUMPTION OF AL-COHOLIC LIQUOR AT THE SPECIAL EVENT UNDER K.S.A. 41-719(a)(2); AND INCORPORATING IN THIS ORDI-NANCE ALL OTHER PROVISIONS OF ORDINANCE NO 698 INCLUDING PROVIDING FOR REGULATIONS; AND FOR PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

Be it Ordained by the Governing Body of the City of Lincoln Center Kansas:

SECTION 1. SPECIAL EVENT APPROVED. The VFW street dance community event held within the City of Lincoln Center, Kansas on such dates and times as determined by the VFW board, is approved as a special event within the City as provided by K.S.A. 41-719(a)(2).

SECTION 2. CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR AT SPECIAL EVENT. Alcoholic

liquor may be consumed at the special event held on public streets, alleys, roads, sidewalks or highways when a temporary permit including a temporary permit from the city have been issued pursuant to K.S.A. 41-2645 and K.S.A. 41-719(a)(2), and amendments thereto, for such special event. No alcoholic liquor may be consumed inside vehicles while on public streets, alleys, roads, or highways at any such special event.

SECTION 3. LOCATION OF SPECIAL EVENT. The 4th Street, between Lincoln Avenue and Court Street, Lincoln, Kansas, is approved as the location for the special event in which the sale and consumption of alcoholic liquor is approved. Event attendees twenty-one (21) and older may buy, possess, and consume alcoholic beverages in the specified area and during the times of the Event. The sale and consumption of alcoholic liquor is not permitted for the Event at other locations within the city unless specifically approved by the Governing Body of the City which approval of an alternative or additional location shall be by ordinance adopted by the Governing Body. It shall be the duty of the Event organizer and the vendor(s) to restrict access to alcoholic beverages to those persons twenty-one (21) or older.

SECTION 4. INCORPORATES ORDINANCE NO. 698. All other sections of Ordinance No. 698, specifically Sections 4 through 9 of said Ordinance No. 698, are incorporated in this Ordinance by reference.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.

RESOLUTION NO. 25-03

A RESOLUTION FIXING A TIME AND PLACE FOR A HEARING BEFORE THE GOVERNING BODY TO DETERMINE WHETHER A STRUC-TURE LOCATED AT 729 N. 9TH STREET, LIN-COLN, KANSAS, IS DANGEROUS, UNSAFE, AND UNFIT FOR HUMAN HABITATION, AND DETER-MINE WHETHER THE STRUCTURE SHOULD BE CONDEMNED AND ORDERED REPAIRED, OR DEMOLISHED.

WHEREAS, Chapter 4, Article 6 of the Code of the City of Lincoln Center, Kansas ("Code") authorizes the governing body (the "Governing Body") of the City of Lincoln Center, Kansas (the "City"), upon receiving a report from the code enforcement officer charging that any structure is dangerous, unsafe, or unfit for human habitation, to fix a date, time, and place at which the owner, owner's agent, any lienholder of records, and any occupant of the structure, may appear and show cause why the structure should not be condemned and ordered repaired, or demolished

WHEREAS, the Governing Body, upon receiving a report from the code enforcement officer regarding the condition of 729 N 9th Street, Lincoln, Kansas, has determined it is necessary and advisable to set a time a place for hearing to determine whether the structure is dangerous, unsafe, and unfit, at which time and place the owner, owner's agent, any lienholder of records, and any occupant of the structure, may appear and show cause why the structure should not be found dangerous, unsafe, and unfit and thereby condemned and ordered repaired, or demolished;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERN-ING BODY OF THE CITY OF LINCOLN CENTER, KANSAS

SECTION 1. Petition. The Governing Body hereby finds and determines that the report dated March 28, 2025, filed by the code enforcement officer as it relates to the holes in the roof of the residential structure located at 729 N. 9th Street, Lincoln, Kansas, that is reportedly attracting rodents and varmints to the neighborhood meets the requirements of Section 4-603 and 4-604 of the Code.

SECTION 2. Public Hearing. It is hereby authorized, ordered and directed that the Governing Body shall hold a public hearing in accordance with the provisions of the Section 4-605 of the Code, at which time the owner, owner's agent, any lienholder of records, and any occupant of the structure, may appear and show cause why the structure should not be found dangerous. unsafe, and unfit and thereby condemned and ordered repaired or demolished, and such other matters related thereto, with such public hearing to be held on September 8, 2025 at 6:30 p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard, in the City Council meeting room located at City Hall, at 153 W. Lincoln Avenue, Lincoln, Kansas, under the authority of the Code.

SECTION 3. Notice of Hearing. The City Clerk is hereby authorized, ordered, and directed to give notice of said public hearing by publication of this Resolution in the official City newspaper. Such publication shall be at least once each week for two consecutive weeks. At least 30 days shall elapse between the last publication and the date set for the hearing. The City Clerk is hereby further

ordered and directed to mail a copy of this Resolution, via certified mail, the owner, owner's agent, any lienholder of records. and any occupant of the structure within three days after this Resolution is first published.

SECTION 4. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect and be in full force immediately after its adoption by the Governing Body of the City.
