# A LITTLE BIT OF THE PAST

#### LUCAS MOVIES

Lawrence and Ralph Gilbreath were co-owners of "The Rex Theatre" which opened 11/23/1913 with "cozy seats, good music, elevated floor, good pictures." On 5/16/1914 the Gilbreath Brothers opened "The Wonderland Airdome" with special music by Miss O'Brien at the piano and Harold Deeble on drums.

Between 1914 and 1925, movies were shown at "The Paramount" and "Red Arrow Picture Show". Admission to the latter was gained with "Red Arrow Money" from business sponsors.

When the "Queen Theatre" (opened 1925) burned in 1929, L.R. Richolson and Lawrence Gilbreath owned the equipment. "The New Isis Theatre" opened on the present site in May 1930 by owners Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Gilbreath; the beginning of "talkies". The Lucas Sunflower Band furnished music for the grand opening attended by approximately six hundred paid admissions. The movie, "Sunny Side Up" was received with "uproarious laughter".

The theatre was equipped with an Arctic Nu-Air cooling system; described as "refreshing as the sea breeze" and cool as a mountain cavern". In September 1941, automatic gas heat was installed. Included in the building was a stage used for home talent shows, school and organization presentations.

Fire destroyed the theatre in 1951 and 1959. Loren Cullen reopened the Isis in 1960. Bob and Lola Brant are current owners, purchasing it in 1963. No movies are shown there now; television and home video systems have greatly reduced the demand for theatres.

During the writers youthful movie attendance (40s and early 50s), children were admitted free until they started first grade. From grades 1-8 tickets were nine cents. When you entered high school the adult rate of \$0.29 was paid - rates varied. Attending the first showing of a movie allowed you free admission for any additional run of the same movie

The Gilbreaths loved to entertain - especially the children of the community. It is impossible to estimate the number of hours they spent "babysitting". The "rowdy" youngsters were discreetly reprimanded and received "special attention" from Stella: the children loved to tease and Stella responded by sitting with the noisemakers.

Lawrence passed away in 1964. Stella, whom celebrated her 90th birthday last October 6th, is one of our most highly respected citizens... a Lucas treasure.

#### ROY MILLER

August 6, 1930 - "They Like The Water" - "Roy Miller tells us that even in this day of homemade beer, soda pop and all kinds of sweetened ice cold drinks, that lots of people like good cold well water. Recently on an exceptionally hot day he kept a record of the people who stopped at his well by the roadside for a cool refreshing drink and in a period of only three hours there were 165 persons who drank at his well. Roy keeps the windmill at the east side of his lot running constantly and the water goes directly from the mill into the fountain. Above the fountain is a song inviting the passerby to stop and have a drink. In addition to the drinking fountain Roy has a dandy tourist camp at the west of his house with four cabins, a windmill to furnish water and a cook house. He has the park planted to young trees and around each tree is a circle of flowers that are kept growing this hot weather by irrigation from the windmill. He also has a number of apparatus for the youngsters to play on, including a merry-go-round. Many people of Lucas and vicinity avail themselves of the opportunity of going to the Miller Camp for their picnics".

July 12, 1933 - "Petrified Tree Found" - "The latest addition to the interesting collection of Roy Miller in way of petrified materials is a 2,000 pound petrified tree taken from Spillman Creek northeast of Lucas. Mr. Miller brought it in Saturday. Among the other features of his Rock Garden are some petrified bones secured southwest of Lucas, some Iron rock taken from near the highway between Lucas and Luray and some other rocks of peculiar formation from the Blue Hills.

Anyone interested in geology should visit Mr. Miller's collection.

Mr. Miller also has built out rock of various kinds, a representation of Pike's Peak with its auto road and the Royal Gorge, south of Colorado Springs."

July 28, 1948 - "Plenty Of Water For Lucas Citizens Now" - "The last chapter in the solution of Lucas water troubles was written last week when Roy E. Miller, as an outright gift, deeded to the City of Lucas the tract of land upon which stands the new city well. Everyone knew long before this that Roy had the welfare of his fellowman at heart through the construction of the recreation facilities near his home for the use of his neighbors and friends. But the gift of the new well site is further proof of the generosity of this good citizen..."
