All IN THE MATTER OF a "C" meant was that I was just doing enough to get by and most good colleges did not want a squeaker or someone that just does enough work to squeak by (this of course being the wisdom of my mother). As an adult, I have to agree with my mother, but could not understand why she had not been as hard on my cheerleading sister as she had been on me for bringing She explained that in the case of my sister, she

watched as she spent time each evening on her homework, or essay, or studying for a test and could testify that indeed she had worked as hard as her older sister, if not harder, and the grade may not have reflected her effort, but she had definitely made the attempt to bring home the better grade. Some things do not come as easy to some as they do to others and she had eventually come to the conclusion that her daughter was not in any sense of the letter, an "A" student, but was putting out an "A" effort.

I on the other hand, like my oldest sister, found good grades easy to come by and only made C's when I was lacking in effort. "Colleges don't accept C's," my mother would always say, "and real life swallows those who set their goals to just squeak by."

I can be pretty strict about grades in my household, but it's only because I know that with a little more effort, A's and B's are fairly easy to obtain. If you want to wait until that last moment to do that paper for English class, or study for that test, or even crack a book for your required accelerated reader points, than maybe you're not putting out all of the effort that you possibly should or could.

There is a reason why some teachers never offer any ways to gain extra credit to put towards your grade. Those who actually need the extra credit could put that extra effort into the actual assignment and improve on their grade and those who don't need the extra credit should not be punished for putting out the effort (if that made any sense to any body...I lost myself somewhere around the extra effort statement). All I'm trying to say is, nothing replaces actually putting out the effort to get the grade and any extra credit, although earned, most times is not warranted.

Students need to crack down on themselves to better prepare for their future collegiate opportunities. Your senior year in high school is not the time to discover that maybe you were one too many C's over the line and a year or two at junior college is coming before K-State (or KU or any other college with certain expectations for the student body they choose to accept). Don't set limitations on yourself without actually getting out there and seeing what this baby can do. Raise the bar, up the ante, and put forth your best effort before condemning yourself to a life as a "C" student. There's so much more out there for those willing to take education and life by the reigns and rodeo ride that little punk for all it's worth.


