Harry M. Mann Missing in Action

Pfc. Harry M. Mann is missing in action near the Saar sector.

He was reported missing in action in Germany on Dec. 12, according to a telegraphic message received by his wife on December 23 from the War Department.

Pfc. Mann is the son of Mr. and Mrs. O. M. Mann of Edson, Kansas, also a brother of C. W. Mann, of Atwood.

–Cpl. Baird Hill, who has been stationed in the Hawaiian Islands for some time, has notified his parents that he is now somewhere in the Philippine Islands.

–Pfc. Billy Hill is in a hospital somewhere in Belgium, according to word received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Hill. No more details were given, but he has been in the hospital for the past month.

–Walter Hamill, who was wounded in action in France some time in September and who has been in a hospital in England for the past one and one-half months, has been returned to the United States and is at present in Halloran General Hospital, Staten Is-

Applications open for Boys State 2025

The American Legion Boys State of Kansas is accepting applications for its 2025 session. The event is set to be held Sunday, June 1, through Saturday, June 7, at Kansas State University in Manhattan. This will be the program’s 33rd consecutive session at KSU and 87th overall.

Traditionally, Kansas Boys State has been for individuals who will complete their junior year of high school in the spring just prior to the start of each session. However, the ALBSK program will again expand the pool of applicants for this year’s session to also include those who will complete their sophomore year of high school this spring.

Boys State is a “learning by doing” political exercise that simulates elections, political

parties and government at the state, county and local levels, providing opportunities to lead under pressure, showcasing character and working effectively within a team. It’s also an opportunity to gain pride and respect for government, and the price paid by members of the military to preserve democracy.

The cost to attend the Boys State of Kansas program is \$375; however, in many instances, sponsors pay the majority of the fees, with the delegate or his family paying \$50. Those wishing to attend the 2025 session should visit ksbstate.org to apply. The deadline to apply for the 2025 program is Wednesday, April 30; applications are accepted after that date, but on a space-available basis. In addition, those

who register by Friday, Jan. 31, will receive a \$50 early-bird discount.

Kansas Boys State attendees are eligible to receive a three-hour course credit (Introduction to Political Science [POLSC 110]) through Kansas State University, as well as earn merit badges to attain the Eagle Scout rank through Boy Scouts of America. Additionally, attendees can apply to win a Samsung American Legion Scholarship. The American Legion Department of Kansas finalist is guaranteed to receive a \$1,250 schol-

arship, with the opportunity to receive up to \$10,000 as a national scholar.

Delegates, nominated by their school counselors or other influential persons in their lives, are sponsored by American Legion posts and various civic organizations across Kansas. All delegates demonstrate outstanding leadership qualities in student government, athletics and/or other activities.
