Smith Co. Commissioners Meeting Minutes

July 28, 2025

The County Commissioners met in a regular session on July 28, 2025, in the County Commissioners' room. Present were Commissioners Brady Peterson and Jim Gwennap. Also present was Ashley Maxwell, Clerk, Travis Story, Assistant Road Supervisor and Mitch Fritz, Road Supervisor.

At 8:30 a.m. Gwennap called the meeting to order and opened with prayer.

A motion was made by Gwennap and seconded Peterson to approve the 7/21/2025 regular minutes and 7/23/2025 special minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Peterson and seconded by Gwennap to approve the 7/28/2025 agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Peterson and seconded by Gwennap to approve 5 longevity pay increases. Motion carried unanimously.

Peterson shared he was in contact with Mike with USDA. Peterson shared the current interest rate and the lengths of the loan. Peterson shared the fiscal year is Oct. 1. Mike suggested we reach out to Senator Moran's office for grant opportunities.

Maxwell shared a letter from Nicole Crawford. Crawford stated she will be on a leave of absence and requests no payment for the month of August.

Maxwell shared the quarterly health insurance report.

Allen Lanus joined the meeting and discussed the following:

1. Lanus stated he has a couple of employees interested in CPR training.

2. Lanus stated he attended a webinar training through Rapid Deploy.

3. Lanus stated Kodie Bixler, Andrea Carver and Tiffany Wiseman will be attending APCO training in September. Kent will also be attending for his longevity recognition. Lanus shared Brett Decker recertified with NCIC, so he will be available for fill in shifts.

3. School enrollment is also next week. Brittany and Alaina will be attending the enrollment.

5. Hageman shared the current measle count is 90

6. Hageman shared there will be an additional grant cut in public health.

Hageman asked about the 2026 budgets since the process was different this year. Gwennap informed the group that all budgets were approved and the budget hearing will be held August 18, 2025.

The next department head meeting will be held September 29, 2025.

At 2:48 p.m. a motion was made by Gwennap and seconded by Peterson to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.
