

A Century of Memories

Vula Roy celebrates her 100th birthday

What is the secret to a long and happy

Nobody has the exact answer, and even Vula, who will celebrate her 100th birthday, said she doesn't know the an-

However, after visiting with Vula and her daughters, it seems the answer for Vula revolves around prioritizing family first, never letting the grass grow under her feet, and being ahead of her timeshe was "organic" before organic food became popular.

So, in honor of her 100 years, Vula was celebrated with a birthday party at the K of C Hall in Damar on Sunday, May 25th, with more than 120 family members and friends.

Vula Mae Felderman's story began when she was born to Albert Henry and Myrtle Faye (Koons) on June 3rd, 1925, in her parents' farmhouse, 16 miles west and two miles north of Stockton. They moved to Parker, Colorado for a few years until the spring of 1930 before moving back to Kansas and the town of Osborne. Vula, along with her brother Clive and sister Ila Dell attended school

at the one-room schoolhouse one mile east of the corner of their pasture. When that schoolhouse closed due to a lack of

students, they attended Liberty School. Vula graduated eighth grade at Stockton with the rest of the towns in Rooks County. She then spent a year of high school in Edgewater, Colorado with her Grandma and Grandpa Koons before coming home and completing the last few years of high school at Webster.

Vula reminisced about her childhood talking about spending time with her dad, feeding the horses, and having to stand on a chair to wash the dishes in a dishpan with her mother. For a special treat, Vula and her sister would trade eggs at the corner store for ice cream!

Vula's husband, Omer Eli Roy, was born on October 4th, 1908, on a farm three miles north and three miles east of Damar. He was married to Olive Roberts of Palco in the St. Ann Church in Zurich. The couple had two children, Joe and Alice. Olive passed away while pregnant with their third child. Omer and the two children moved back to live with his parents with Omer helping his dad on the family farm.

A few years later, Vula met Omer on a blind date. In January of her senior year, Gil Roy, who also went to school at Webster, came to their
