A RESOLUTION BANNING THE INSTALLATION OF SOLAR CELLS PANELS MANUFACTURED UNDER FORCED LABOR FROM CHINA IN LABETTE COUNTY, KANSAS

WHEREAS, the United States President signed into law the Uyghur Forced Labor Prevention Act (UFLPA): and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Homeland Security announced a list of businesses, including solar supply chain providers, produced in the Xinjiang region of China were believed to have been built upon Uyghur forced labor; and WHEREAS, effective January 15, 2025, the United States Customs and Border Protection are to apply a rebuttable presumption that goods produced by the named entities will be prohibited from entering the United States as a result of the companies activities; and

WHEREAS, the Labette County Board of County Commissioners, having discussed the matter and the interests of Labette County residents, the Board has issued a resolution prohibiting the installation of solar cells and solar cell arrays in Labette County, Kansas, that were produced from forced labor under the federal UFLPA NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LABETTE COUNTY BOARD OF **COUNTY COMMISSIONERS:**

Solar cells and solar cell arrays produced from the forced labor of the Uyghur population under the UFLPA and enforced under the United States Department of Homeland Security are banned from installation within the boundaries of Labette County, Kansas. This resolution shall take effect upon its publication in the county newspaper

A CHARTER ORDINANCE EXEMPTING THE CITY OF ALTAMONT, KANSAS, FROM THE PROVISIONS OF K.S.A 12-1222 RELATION TO THE REQUIRE-MENT THAT MEMBERS OF THE MUNICIPAL LIBRARY BOARD BE RESIDENTS OF THE MUNICIPALITY AND PROVIDING FOR SUBSTITUTE PROVISIONS AND CREATING SECTION 2, OF THIS CHARTER ORDINANCE OF THE CITY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ALTAMONT,

WHEREAS, the City of Altamont, Kansas (the "City"), is a city of the third class duly or-ganized and existing under the laws of the State of Kansas; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 12, Section 5, of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, cities are empowered to determine their local affairs and government except for legislative enactments applicable uniformly to all cities; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the City hereby determines that it is in the best inter-est of the City to exempt the City from K.S.A. 12-1222 and to provide substitute provisions for such statute NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE

CITY OF ALTA-MONT, KANSAS: Section 1. Inapplicability. The City, by virtue of the powers vested in it by Article 12,

Section 5, of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, hereby elects to exempt itself from and hereby make inapplicable to it the provisions of K.S.A. 12-1222. Such referenced provision is applicable to the City but is part of enactments not uniformly applicable to all cities, and the City finds and determines it necessary and advisable to provide substitute provisions as set forth herein.

Section 2. Substitute Provisions. By virtue of the powers vested in it by Article 12, Section 5 of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, the City hereby enacts the following substi-tute and additional provisions of K.S.A. 12-1222 by the approval and passing of Charter Ordi-nance 12 and is created to read as follows

Membership of the Library Board for the City of Altamont, Kansas shall be made up of 7 members, in which no less than 5 shall be residents of the City of Altamont, Kansas, with the remaining 2 members being residents of the territory of U.S.D. 506. Nothing shall prevent membership of the library board from consisting of more than the minimum number of residents of the City of Altamont as provided herein, but in no event shall members chosen from those persons residing outside the City of Altamont, Kansas, exceed the number provided.

Section 3. This Charter Ordinance shall be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in the official city newspaper.

Section 4. The Charter Ordinance shall take effect sixty-one (61) days after final publication, unless a sufficient petition for a referendum is filed and a referendum held on the ordinance, as provided in Article 12, Section 5, Subdivision C (3) of the Constitution of the State of Kansas, in which case, the ordinance shall become effective if approved by a majority of the electors voting thereon.
