Head Coach Madeline Martin, who was named League Coach of the Year for 2025, talked about the team's makeup and competitive spirit.

"Our girls have had a great season against some tough competition," Martin said. "They have fought hard for personal best times, continuous improvements, and have shown a great amount of sportsmanship. My favorite part of our team is that these girls are a family. You can't tell that they are from different schools; they cheer for each other, laugh with each other, cry together, and support each other through and through. Fort Scott Tiger swimming will continue to be one family."

Martin explained the scoring and placing at the interleague meet, which she said can be confusing.

"The top 16 finishers earn points for the team with the top eight earning a medal,' she said. "Only one relay can count for points per each relay event and only three swimmers per team per event can count for points. So, some girls earned points even though they may have finished 18th or 19th.'


