Red Hawks compete at home in Track and Field Invitational

The Hiawatha Red Hawk Track and Field team competed at home Tuesday evening as they competed with Doniphan West, Troy Public Schools, Maur Hill Mount Hill Academy, Nemaha Central and Riverside in a variety of events.

The Lady Red Hawks gave a strong performance, especially during the track race events. Pauly Rockey sped off at lightning speed in first place in the Girls' 1600 meter run, followed by Taryn McMullen at fifth, Ava Andres at eighth and Aradessa Morton at 10th. Rockey also blazed through the Girls' 800 meter run, followed by Andres at sixth, Morton at 10th and Lexys Ruch at 10th. Ali Krauter went warp speed and earned first place in the Girls' 3200 meter run, followed by Bri Guilliams at third place, McMullen at fifth place and Harper Chandler at 9th.

The Lady Red Hawks also earned their spots well in other areas. For the Girls' 100 Meter Dash, Laura Lierz placed third, followed by Kyndall Nelson at fifth, Jaci Feldkamp at 13th and Kylee Shaefer at 15th. In the Girls' 200 Meter Dash, Kyndall Nelson earned fifth, followed by Feldkamp at 9th and Jana Caparros at 13th. Laura Lierz earned second in Girls 100 Hurdles and she also earned second place in the Girls' 300 Meter Hurdles category. In the Girls' 4X100 Meter Relay, Laura Lierz, Tessa Jones, Bri Guilliams and Nelson earned first place in that category. Nelson also earned fourth in the Girls' 400 Meter Dash, followed by Chandler at sixth.

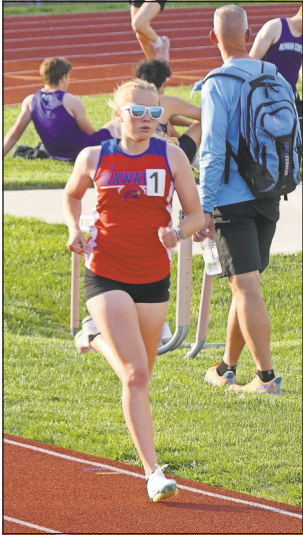
Tessa Jones placed third in both the Girls' Long Jump and Girls' Triple Jump. Briley Siebenmorgen threw and scored a major hit by earning first place in the Girls' Discus Throw, followed by Taylor Waggoner at 10th and Covert at 12th. For Girls' Javelin Throw, Jones placed third while Shaefer placed 13th. In Girls' Shot Put, Siebenmorgen scored second place, followed by Covert at eighth and Waggoner at 12th. Overall, the Lady Red Hawks

earned second in the overall team rankings during the track event.

The Red Hawk boys also gave strong performances at the home invitational meet. Karson Henry stormed through the track and scored first place in the Boys' 200 Meter Dash, followed by Phoenix Entrikin at

fifth, Ethan Morton at seventh and Gage Cappleman at eighth. Gus Smith reached an astounding first place in the Boys' 100 Meter Hurdles category. In the Boys' 100 Meter Dash, Connor Kettler earned second, followed by Henry at fifth, Smith at seventh and Jaxon Bailey at 13th. In the Boys' 4X100 Meter

Relay, the Red Hawk boys earned first place with Henry, Entrikin, Morton and Kettler. In the Boys' 4X800 Relay, Colten Gormley, Zander Ruch, Cooper Andres and Gabe Joslin earned second for that category for Hiawatha. In the Boys'

1600 Meter Run, Clay Handke earned fourth, followed by Aiden Hartter at eighth, Joslin at 12th and Max Smith at 13th. In the Boys' 800 Meter Run, Xavier Boeckman placed third, followed by Ruch at sixth, Andres at seventh and Smith at 11th.

In Boy's Javelin, Gage Cappleman aimed his spear true and earned first with a well placed throw, followed by Jaxon Bailey at fifth, Cooper Handke at 10th and Memphis Trundle at 11th. Kameron Winder hit hard by earning first place in the Boys' Shot Put category. Jose Valencia threw his disc to earn a high first place in the Boys' Discus Throw category, followed by Winder who earned eighth in that area. Aaron Yang placed third in the Boys' Triple Jump. Yang placed fifth in the Boys' Long Jump category, followed by Bailey at ninth place.

Overall, the Red Hawk boys ranked first in team rankings at the invitational event.

The Red Hawk track team will compete at Rossville on Friday, April 25.
