THE FESTIVAL will also be an opportunity to showcase a new light system at Revival Music Hall, a former church converted into a performance venue.

"It's happening at the right pace," Kunkler said of the church's transformation, which has transpired thanks to the extended family of Joe and Janie Works working in league with A Bolder Humboldt.

On top of new light and sound systems,

the facility also sports acoustic panels on the second-floor seating area for better sound quality.

"I figured COVID took about 18 months off the timeline," Kunkler said. "It probably took a year and a half to get the sound system off back-order. It was crazy."

But the delays also allowed for more time to figure out the ideal design throughout the rest of the building.

The basement has been converted into a lodging space for performers, with sleeping quarters for up to eight people, two full showers, a hospitality area, kitchen and even a side room filled with religious artifacts from

when the structure was still a house of worship.

"I got to davdreaming about how if you're a musician out on the road, what do you need?" she asked.

(So she added a washer and dryer set.)

Next on the to-do list is to hire a venue manager in order to get a regular performance schedule in place.

Kunkler insists she's far from the only organizer who puts the Middle of Everywhere together.

"But I'm lucky to be a part of this," she said. "This has taken some time to put together, and we knew it would. But the thought was, let's get this secure and
