# Pleasanton okayed to move water line to ball field

After a lengthy discussion on eliminating the city fire department, see story in this week's Linn County News, the Pleasanton City Council approved a request from Mayor Mathew Young, who was speaking as a citizen, to remove an 18-inch portion of culvert that joins a 36-inch culvert in his in-law's yard.

Young said the joining causes water to back up and asked that it be taken back to what it was prior to the 18-inch culvert being added.

The council approved the removal leaving it as the creek it was.

The council made a motion to solicit bids for both a sewer line from Cedar Street to Laurel Street and tree removal in the line of construction.

They next approved bringing a water line to the ball field to be attached to a spigot for no more than \$2,000.

Ordinance 2060 was approved that makes it illegal to camp at a city lake for more than 10-days. After that period, a person must move off of the city lake before moving back in to any city lake.

Ordinance 2061 was approved stating anyone driving a golf cart must have a valid driver's license.

Ordinance 2062 was approved and deals with door-to-door salesman and solicitors.

# La Cygne Antique Quilt Show extends display at museum

The La Cygne Historical Society will extend the Antique Quilt Show display through the months of May and June by public demand. The May and June Museum hours will be Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. each of these five days.

The month of April has been very busy at the Museum. We have had many visitors come in to view the Antique Quilts display and antique tools for hand quilting. In addition, we invited area students to come to the Museum, view the Antiques Quilts, learn how to hand quilt and create and sign their own quilt blocks. These students were also given autograph books to keep as their own and learned about what to do with these books and the origin of autographs books in the 1600's. The students enjoyed the many short rhymes and sayings that were often written in the old

antique autographs books that have been donated to the Museum over the years.

The first students to arrive at the Museum to create their quilt blocks were the third grade from the La Cygne Elementary on Wednesday, April 16; the second group of students to show up were La Cygne's 5<sup>th</sup> grade on Tuesday, April 22.

La Cygne's 4<sup>th</sup> grade class was thrilled to come to do their quilt blocks on Thursday, April 24, and an Art Class from Prairie View will be at the Museum on Friday, May 9, to see the Antique Quilts. While they are there they will create and sew their own individual quilt blocks to take with them.

We need your help! We have a mystery quilt that has 1015 names embroidered on the 20 blocks. Some of these names are unfamiliar to the curator and volunteers at the Museum. If you recognize any of these following names please come to the Museum and tell us what you

know about these families' last names: Blout, Bottrell, Carrico or Carrics, Hardenbrook, Lewellyn, Rutledge and Tomacelli. One of the blocks has the words "Non Paniel Class" - is this a name of a Sunday School Class?

"La Cygne Kansas, 1925" is embroidered on one block. A couple of other blocks have the dates: 1925, 1927, 1932 and Oct. 1946.

Eight of these quilts on display have names embroidered on them. Many of the names you will know, such as Leigh Ann Stainbrook and Danny VanVlack. Other names from Linn County's by-gone days that you may recognize are: Jean Sylvester, Jay Marris, Leatha Wade, Harold Mooney and Ethel Lindsey.
