35 years ago

April 26, 1990

The Oskaloosa Independent has been honored by its peers at the 1990 Kansas Press Association Awards of Excellence banquet.

The newspaper was the recipient of four first-place awards, three second-place, three third-place, and one honorable mention.

Oskaloosa sophomore Lisa Cropper won her team's only gold medals at the Cardinal Relays in Eudora April 20.

Cropper claimed first-place finishes in the long jump, high jump, and 880-yard run.

The mile relay team placed second with a time of 4:34.1. Amy Parker finished third in the 400-meter dash with a time of 1:06.9. Erica Barrett was fourth in the shotput with a toss of 28.7 and sixth in the mile with a time of 6:42.9. The 440-yard relay team also took sixth place with a time of 58.9.

Winchester Mayor Robert Henning received the keys to a new fire truck from Marc Lewis, president of Haul Mor Inc., Valley Falls, last week.

The city took delivery of the 2-ton Ford to replace a 1964 model. The fire department works in cooperation with Jefferson Township firefighters and the equipment is housed in the township fire building. Ronald Meyer is the fire chief.

The Jefferson County Soil Conservation Service and the Jefferson County Conservation District coordinated an environmental festival with Earth Day 1990 for a group of area middle school students.

The festival, actually taking place at Perry Lake April 23, one day after the official Earth Day, was really an outside classroom designed to expose students to the environment and show them how the environment depends on the human race and the human race depends on the environment.

Rex Taylor, a former Kansas Highway Patrol officer, who has been working for the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department while working on completing his master's degree in public administration at the University of Kansas, will be the new chief of police for the city of Maize.

Residents of the Jefferson County Memorial Geriatric Center, Winchester, were joined by 40 children for an Easter egg hunt April 21.

The children were from the TLC Daycare along with employees' children and grandchildren.

McLouth junior Robert Smith will participate in the USA Junior National Championship Sports Festival in Madison, Wisc., in July.

He will compete to play on one of five national basketball teams who will tour throughout the country playing pick-up games with college teams.

Smith was a starter this year on the McLouth basketball team and averaged 17 points a game.

Oskaloosa sophomore Larry Subelka won the shotput event at the Jefferson West High School Track and Field Invitational with a 46-foot, 1-inch throw. He placed fifth in the discus event.

Oskaloosa boys' team placed fifth out of eight schools.

Jefferson County North senior Brandon Noll will present a one-man show titled "Clarence Darrow" on the high school stage on May 4.

Noll chose to perform the play as his senior project be-

cause he wanted to experience a role that explores a character in more depth than a multi-role play could provide. He said a one-man play is also more challenging because there are no stage cues to follow.

Hayley Barnes, 11, Oskaloosa, was recently awarded a third-place prize in the Federal Junior Duck Stamp Conservation and Design Program.

She submitted a drawing of a Canada goose she drew in art class.

Barnes is a fifth-grader at Oskaloosa Elementary School. She is the daughter of Cathy and Jay Barnes.

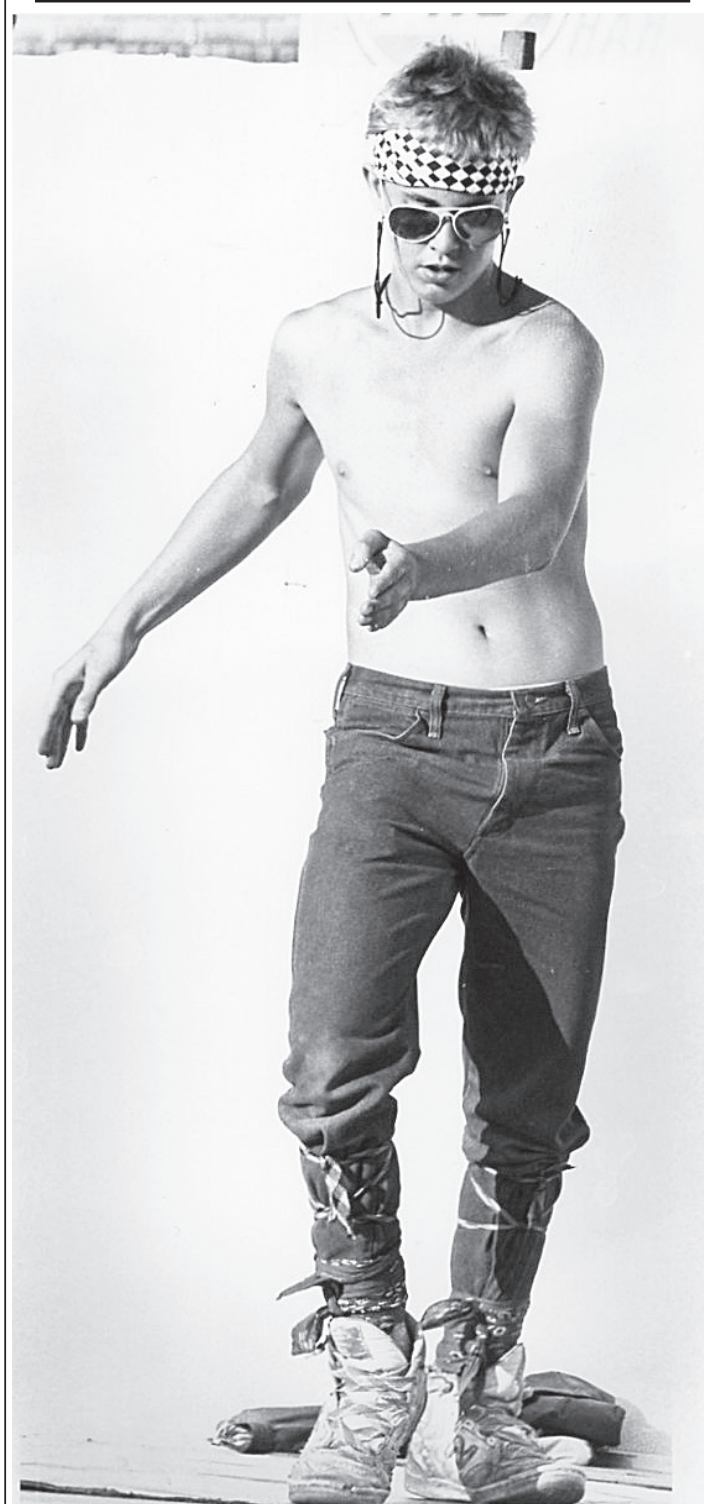
The FOOLs (Friends of the Oskaloosa Library) recently completed a successful book sale with over \$2,000 in items for sale. There was something for everyone.
