The Rossville softball team traveled last Tuesday to Holton, splitting the double header with the Lady Wildcats. They won the first game 2-1, but lost the second 5-4.
On Thursday, they hosted the Nemaha Central Thunder, losing both of those games.

Scoring was hard to come by in the first Holton game, as both teams blanked the scoreboard until the top of the fifth inning when Rossville plated Payton Dick as Nora Burdick hit a ball to left field.
Rossville added another run at the top of the seventh when Brooke Springer scored on a Falyn Clurman double, but Holton could only answer with one, so the Lady Dawgs took the game.
The second Holton game was also hard fought. Rossville scored in the first inning, and then again in the third, but Holton added five runs in the next two innings for a 5-2 lead. The Lady Dawgs tried for a comeback in the seventh inning, but only managed two runs, falling 5-4.

Rossville went on to add four runs in the top of the third and two more in the top of the fourth for the win. The game was highlighted by a Cameron Miller home run to center field which scored two runs and a Connor Bush double, also scoring two. Cael Horgan took the win on the mound.
The second game of the series against the Thunder ran just six innings, as Rossville took a 12-1 victory.
