She wanted to do her part to keep the phones operating in case of emergencies during the

In 1958, Helen married Joe Donohue. They celebrated 60 years of marriage before his passing. The marriage was blessed with a son Daryl who provided the couple with much pride and joy.

They spent their lives engaged in farming and ranching north of Fredonia. In 1998, they retired and moved to town when Daryl and daughter-inlaw Jody took over the busi-

Helen was preceded in death by her parents, husband, sisters Alma Bade and Dorothy Vaughn and brothers Harold Pryor and Lee Pryor.


Cathy Ann Howard

A sobriety checkpoint, intended to remove impaired drivers, will be set up in Labette County on Friday, April 4. "The purpose of these

checkpoints," said Technical

Trooper Gary Boles, "is to decrease traffic crashes through awareness and enforcement." Sobriety checkpoints are

aimed at reducing collision rates by identifying impaired The goal of this checkpoint

is to encourage compliance with the alcohol related statutes of this state, by removing drivers from Kansas roadways that are under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs. Annually about 11,000

persons are killed in alcohol related traffic crashes, averaging one alcohol related fatality every 39 minutes. These deaths constitute approximately 32% of the total traffic fatalities.
