Four drug-related arrests result from search warrant at Cherryvale residence

CHERRYVALE — Four arrests resulted from a search warrant that was executed in the 200 Block of North Neosho Street here on Thursday, April 10 by Montgomery County Sheriff’s deputies and agents from the Kansas Bureau of Investigation, aided by officers from the Cherryvale Police Department.

All occupants inside of the residence at the time of the warrant were safely detained during the operation.

The warrant was obtained as part of an ongoing investigation involving multiple burglaries and suspected narcotic activity in the area. During the search, the officers located more than six grams of powder fentanyl, which has an estimated street value of around \$6,000. They also located methamphetamine, marijuana, drug paraphernalia and multiple firearms, as well as items that were identified as stolen and connected to a current Montgomery County Sheriff’s Office case.

The following people were taken into custody and transported to the Montgomery County Department of Corrections:

- Jeremiah McKenzie—Distributing opiate (fentanyl) within 1000 feet of a school; criminal possession of a weapon by a felon; criminal use of weapons; shotgun barrel <18”; possession of stimulant (methamphetamine); possession of stolen property and use/possess with intent to use drug paraphernalia into the human body.
- Ashley Melia — Possession of opiate (fentanyl); possession of stimulant (methamphetamine); criminal use of weapons; shotgun barrel <18”; use/possess with the intent to use drug paraphernalia into the human body.
- Ragan Myers — Distributing opiate (fentanyl) within 1000 feet of a school; criminal use of weapons; shotgun barrel <18”; possession of opiate (fentanyl); possession of stimulant (methamphetamine); possession of stolen property; use/possess with intent to use drug
