said. “The magic that happens in a local community when people find out they don’t have to wait to get something done, that they can do it themselves, is incredible.”
Participants also learn from each other, Daniels said, adding that even experienced grant writers pick up tips. Participants are encouraged to bring their grants or grant ideas to share.
Workshop topics include: \ sources of data for community needs; where to find grants; the five common elements of a great grant proposal; and practicing the grant writing elements.
