Ami DeLacerda, County Clerk, gave a department update. Several Personnel Status Forms were submitted, reviewed and approved. Discussion was held on responsibilities of the Zoning committee and a notice to taxing entities affected by a potential large exemption in the future.

Kaw Valley Engineers, returned to the meeting to open sealed bids for the Newberry Bridge Repair project. His estimate for repair is \$708,686.00. Bids were received as follows:

Mr. McCullough will review & recalculate the bids and present a notice of award next week to the Board for approval. The

county's portion of this project is 5%, KDOT will cover 95% up to \$580,800 for construction and construction inspection. There will also be a one-time payment of \$69,200 from KDOT for vacating a bridge on the Kingman County line.

3-4 Boneless skinless chicken breasts	5 Eggs
2 Tsp. Baking Powder	2 Cups Flour
1 Tbsp. Garlic Powder	1/4 Cup Milk
1/2 Tsp. Onion Powder	1/2 Tsp. Pepper
3 Tsp. Poultry Seasoning	1 Tsp. Seasoned Salt
Cooking Oil for Frying	

In a mixing bowl, combine the eggs and milk. In another bowl, mix dry ingredients together. Heat oil in heavy pan. Tenderize the chicken breast until 1/2 inch thick; then cut into strips. Dip strips into egg mixture, then flour mixture. Fry in heated oil.
