# **Martin Resigns as Harper County Attorney**

Daniel P. Martin's turbulent tenure as the Harper County attorney has come to an unceremonious end.

The county's former prosecutor resigned last week after ongoing battles with the county commissioners, as well as with local law enforcement agencies.

All three commissioners addressed the matter at

Monday morning's meeting. And the entire board agreed it was time for a change.

"I would just say it is a step in the right direction," District 2 Commissioner Melinda McCurley said.

Board Chairman Brian Waldschmidt, who represents District 1, said "change was needed."

"We all knew that (and) saw it coming," he said. "It was time."

District 3 Commissioner

Darrin Struble said he knew Harper County residents were ready to see change as well.

Former County Attorney Richard Raleigh has been appointed to fill the vacancy on an interim basis. Raleigh has currently been acting as the county counselor and will continue in that role.

Raleigh will actively search for help covering any potential jury trials that may come up. In the meantime,

the Harper County Republican Committee will being its search for Martin's permanent replacement at least until an election can be held where registered county voters will once again have an opportunity to elect a person to fill the position.

The board did not have an estimated time it would take the committee to make a new appointment.

Earlier this summer, the board of commissioners

held a budget hearing to decrease the salary of the former county attorney, but Monday Waldschmidt said those funds are still in the 2025 budget and could still be used if and when a new county attorney is appointed

"If the Republican Committee comes up with - and I'm just speaking for myself guys - someone that salary will be reinstated," the

board chairman said. "It's my opinion."

He said the new attorney's level of experience could make an impact on the salary as the board will keep an open mind regarding the budget.

Waldschmidt said the proposed 2026 budget was "pretty close to what '25 was."

"So far," he said. "It's (the 2026 budget) not approved yet."
