Kansas' senators cast yes votes for 'One Big Beautiful Bill'

TOPEKA — U.S. Sens. Jerry Moran and Roger Marshall of Kansas voted with fellow Republicans to secure passage of the Senate's controversial budget and tax bill featuring domestic policy priorities of President Donald Trump.

Vice President J.D. Vance capped lengthy debate by casting a tie-breaking vote to send the amended "One Big, Beautiful Bill" back to the U.S. House for reconsideration. The president urged federal lawmakers in the House and Senate to complete work on the package by July 4.

"The lefty fake news media has failed to tell the truth

about this bill, that it will deliver a win every single Mar-American," shall said. "This is President Trump's legacy and we are entering America's golden era." Marshall said

colleagues aligned with the president obligated were to vote for the Senate bill.

"If you supported President Trump, you should support this bill," he said.

In addition, Marshall said the legislation would spark such a massive expansion of the U.S. economy that it would "help shrink the



The claim conflicted with a congressional budget estimate the bill would add at least \$3.3 trillion to the nation's debt over the next decade. The Senate bill would increase the federal debt limit by \$5 trillion.

Moran said he voted for the Senate's bill because it would extend federal income tax provisions Trump signed into law in 2017 and invest \$320 billion in immigration enforcement and the military.

The bill also would slash federal safety net spending on food stamps. It would allow wind and solar tax credits if construction of those renewable energy projects began within a year of the law's enactment or go into production before the end of 2027. Moran said the

Senate's amended version of the bill would "bolster our economy and strengthen the safety of our nation."

His post-vote statement focused on amendments to the bill designed to moderate



of cuts to Medicaid and the Affordable Care Act. "I was able to make changes

to the legislation to make certain Kansas hospitals will not face any immediate cuts upon enactment of this

legislation," Moran said.

Moran lauded a \$50 billion, five-year fund providing emergency assistance to rural hospitals at risk of clo-

Kansas wheat harvest off to slow start

Meanwhile, Moran touted \$12.5 billion in appropriations to the Federal Aviation Administration to modernize air traffic control infrastructure. It included language giving farmers greater flexibility in acquiring credit and updated farm subsidy pro-

In May, the U.S. House delegation from Kansas split along party lines on the original version of the bill. Republican U.S. Rep. Tracey Mann, Derek Schmidt and Ron Estes voted for that package, but Democratic U.S. Rep. Sharice Davids dissented.

got anywhere from 1-8 inches. While rain may be good for other crops, it brings concern for wheat harvesters. Lollato said factors that could lead to a reduction

in yield might include a water-logged field,

which is usually a larger concern during crop development. There have been reports of wa-

ter-logged fields in parts of central Kansas. Late season, water logging "will actually delay progress of harvest. Because of this very wet soil, growers cannot drive on top," Lollato said. "There is also the possibility of increased saprophytic fungi as well as lodging, which we have seen a lot of."

Lollato said grain shattering has been very prevalent this year.

"We started seeing really 3 or 4 weeks ago where some of the glumes (a protective leaf-like structure that holds the kernel) were opened up," Lollato said.

Lollato also said there seems to be an increase in the incidence of weeds, noting that "any water out there available will be used by the weeds.'

'So, no competition for those resources combined with water and warm temperatures that we're having make it excellent conditions for weed emergence," he said.
