Jackson tries to outrun playoff demons as Ravens face Steelers

Lamar Jackson has won the same number of playoff games as NFL MVP trophies: two.

The dearth of postseason victories have been an issue and the Ravens star quarterback looks to change the narrative when third-seeded Baltimore hosts the sixth-seeded Pittsburgh Steelers in the AFC wild-card round on Saturday night.

Jackson owns a 2-4 record in the playoffs, having thrown six interceptions while fumbling six times (losing three) in the postseason. He has thrown for six touchdowns and rushed for three in his playoff career.

In other words, production needs to increase and miscues need to decrease.

And the 28-year-old needs to be more relaxed.

"I'm just too excited -that's all. Too antsy, that's all," Jackson said of his playoff troubles. "I'm seeing things before it happens like, 'Oh, I have to calm myself down.' But just being more experienced, I've found a way to balance it out."

One person who could

come to the rescue is star running back Derrick Henry.

In his first season with the Ravens, Henry rushed for 1,921 yards, second in the NFL, and 16 touchdowns, tied for first. He has played in seven postseason games, and he helped Tennessee reach the AFC Championship Game in the 2019 season

before the Titans lost to the Kansas City Chiefs.

Henry is aware of the team's reputation for coming up short in the playoffs. Just last season, the Ravens were the top seed but eventually lost at home to the Chiefs in the AFC title game.

"We've got to be different this time," Henry said. "I think you all know that

and we all feel that. We all know what we're capable of. Let's go get it."

This will be the fifth postseason meeting between the teams. Pittsburgh won three of the previous four, but the Ravens prevailed in the most recent playoff matchup, 30-17 in the wild-card round on Jan. 3, 2015.

This season, the Ravens (12-5) and Steelers (10-7) split their two regularseason meetings, with each team winning at

The Steelers captured the first game 18-16 behind six field goals from Chris Boswell on Nov. 17. In the rematch on Dec. 21, Iackson threw three touchdown passes and Henry rushed for 162 yards in Baltimore's 34-17 triumph.

Pittsburgh enters the Saturday clash on a fourgame losing streak. The Steelers missed multiple chances to clinch the AFC North before eventually being overtaken by Baltimore, which won its last four contests.

"For us, it's not about being in the tournament. It's not about pouting over the last month," Steelers coach Mike Tomlin said. "It's about this week for us, we're playing someone that we're highly familiar with. They're also highly familiar with us. ... And so there's a lot of work ahead of us in preparation for performance."

Pittsburgh has been outscored 109-57 during the slide and hasn't scored more than 17 points in any of the setbacks.

The Steelers lost 19-17 to the visiting Cincinnati Bengals last week, and the refrain from Pittsburgh players is consistent: Turn the page.

"Everybody doesn't get

a chance to play in the playoffs, everybody doesn't get a chance to prolong their season week by week," Pittsburgh cornerback Donte Jackson said. "So you have to be turned up. You've got to flush everything that happened, and you got to just detail in and hone in on this. The guys don't worry about the last month."

The Steelers will be counting on veteran quarterback Russell Wilson to be steady in his approach. The 36-vear-old won a Super Bowl title with the Seattle Seahawks in the 2013 season and has a 9-7 record in the postseason.

Ravens receiver Zay Flowers (knee) missed his second straight day of practice on Wednesday and remains unlikely to play Saturday. Flowers was injured during the regular-season finale against the Cleveland Browns.

Baltimore returner Deonte Harty (knee) missed practice on Wednesday after being a full participant the day before, when the team activated his 21-day window to return. Harty was injured in Week 6 and missed the rest of the regular season.

Pittsburgh star defensive tackle Cameron Heyward (illness) sat out his second straight practice on Wednesday. Boswell (illness) and tight end MyCole Pruitt (knee) also sat out.

Task for No. 5 Texas: Stop the receivers for No. 8 Ohio State

There are plenty of storylines heading into this year's Cotton Bowl, where two of the winningest programs in college football history will face off for a chance to play for the College Football Playoff national championship.

Still, when No. 5 Texas (13-2) and No. 8 Ohio State (12-2) meet in a semifinal matchup on Friday night in Arlington, Texas, the attention will be focused on the quarter-

Ohio State's Will Howard played against Texas when he was at Kansas State, but the Wildcats went 0-4 versus the Longhorns in those years. Texas' Ouinn Ewers, meanwhile, started his college career with the Buckeyes before transferring to his

home state's school. "That was the only team I didn't beat when I was in the Big 12," Howard said. "There's definitely a little extra motivation because I never got the chance to beat these guys, played them for four years. They're always a good team, but I don't think -none of those games were unwinnable. Last year we lost in overtime. So, definitely excited to get another chance at these guys."

Ewers, who went to high school about 20 miles from AT&T Stadium at Southlake Carroll, has

never faced his former team and only had positive things to say about his one semester with the Buckeyes.

"I don't regret any decision I've made on going or anything like that, but the main reason I went was I felt like I had a great relationship with the coaching staff," Ewers said of his time at Ohio State. "And they were winning a lot of games, and I wanted to go be a part of something like that.

"The reason that I came back to Texas was, one, to be closer to where I'm from and just closer to the resources that I have and the relationships that I've built over time just being from Texas."

Despite the neutral site, this is a home game for Texas. Still, the Buckeyes

have a 3-1 record at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, including a 42-20 win over Oregon in January 2015 to win the first College Football Playoff national championship.

Ten years later, Texas will need to contain Ohio State's dynamic receiving corps led by Jeremiah Smith and Emeka Egbuka, who combined for 2,120 vards and 24 touchdown receptions. Each made 70 catches.

"Yeah, they've got an impressive group out at receiver," Texas defensive back Michael Taaffe said. "They've got four or five guys that are really dangerous. Obviously, Jeremiah is really good. Obviously, Emeka, No. 2, is elite. ... They've got guys you've got to respect out there.'

In Ohio State's 41-21 shellacking of No. 1 Oregon in the CFP quarterfinal at the Rose Bowl on New Year's Day, Howard threw for 319 yards, with Smith hauling in seven catches for 187 yards and two touchdowns.

Another question is whether Texas can get its running game going after averaging just 1.8 yards in its 39-31 double-overtime victory over Arizona State in the quarterfinal at the Peach Bowl. The Longhorns' season average is 4.5 yards per attempt.

Texas coach Steve Sarkisian addressed the running game issues this week.

"We're at our best when we can run it," he said. "That gives us balance. So, I'm hard-pressed not to kind of just walk away from it and abandon it. We've got to do a great job as a staff of putting together a good game plan and making sure that our players can execute it at a high level."

Ohio State undoubtedly will be looking to get off to another fast start. The Buckeyes took a 34-8 lead into halftime against Ohio State and were up 21-0 after one quarter in their 42-17 win over No. 9 Tennessee in their first-round playoff game.

Buckeyes coach Ryan Day said the only motivation his team needs is simply staying alive in the championship race.

"One thing that does motivate our team is an opportunity for the team to play for another week together," he said. "And this is a great group of guys that cares a lot about each other, have fun with each other. They love competing with each other. You can see the passion on the field when they get on the field. The

way that this format is and the way the playoffs are set now, it allows us an opportunity to grow as a team and to learn and to get better and to peak late in the season."

The winner will meet the winner of Thursday night's Orange Bowl between No. 6 Penn State and No. 7 Notre Dame in the CFP championship on Jan. 20 in Atlanta.

Bradley names Kisner US Ryder Cup vice captain

United States captain Keegan Bradley named Kevin Kisner as one of his vice captains for the 45th Ryder Cup on Wednesday.

The competition will be played from Sept. 26-28 at Bethpage Black in Farmingdale, N.Y. Kisner, 40, joins Webb Simpson and Brandt Snedeker, who were previously appointed as vice captains. Additional vice captains will be announced at a

later date. "Kevin is a great addition to our leadership group and will be a trusted voice

throughout the coming months and this year's Ryder Cup," Bradley said. "His extensive match-play success and strong relationships make him a perfect fit. I look forward to working with him closely as we get ready for Bethpage Black."

This marks Kisner's first Ryder Cup as a vice captain or player. He was a captain's assistant for the 2024 Presidents Cup and represented the U.S. in the 2017 and 2022 Presidents Cups, compiling a 2-2-3 career record.

"I am incredibly appreciative of Keegan for this opportunity to help guide the

U.S. team at the 2025 Ryder Cup," Kisner said. "I love match play, and the Ryder Cup is one of the greatest events in sports. I cannot wait to be a part of it and look forward to doing everything I can to support Keegan, Webb, Brandt and our talented team." Kisner is a four-time

winner on the PGA Tour, most recently at the Wyndham Championship in 2021. He is known for strong match play, having won the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play tournament in 2019 and finishing second in that event in 2018 and 2022.
