City Treasurer — City Treasurer Doug Mogle reported that city assets remain stable.

Code Enforcement — Code Enforcement Officer Gary Holt reported that he attended the Kansas Research & Housing Conference on October 27 — 29 in Overland Park.

-Officer Holt shared that he has been updating a vacant property list.

Public Works — Public Works Superintendent Randy Coble reported that public restrooms in the city parks have now been closed and winterized.

-Coble shared that city water crews intend to work this Saturday running the water line to the new housing development on Merle Evans Drive.

Police Department Police Chief Kyle Clark reported that the police department recently participated in the Trunk or Treat event on the square.

-Chief Clark reported several officers will be attending upcoming training.
