"Either way, the concrete company that is putting in the new building pad will want to do their own grading for the site to state their need to ensure their work," Brian Lester said.

"We do have the money to prepare the site to have it ready to have the site prepared, once again, by the concrete company," Scheidegger said. "The new concrete, alternately, will be covered by the grant."

As the evening was intended as a public hearing for the grant, members of the community available for the meeting posed a smattering of questions for both the Council and Waggoner. Resident Sherry Lester asked about the possible

inclusion of a water park for the area kids, which was not possible, as the idea was not a part of the original drafting of the grant request. Tim Nedeau asked if the new building could be put in a more agreeable portion of the park, while the shaded area of the current building would be better used by park-goers as open space. Kentch asked Nedeau to bring a plot plan for his vision of the new building location to the next meeting.

With details of an altercation involving a minor, which could not be discussed openly in the meeting, coming to light, Scheidegger requested a sum of money be granted to City Police Officer Ted McDaniel to replace vandalized equipment. The monies were granted, and it was equally requested that a bill be sent to the parents of the offending
