

County approves agreement for improvements to Old Highway 83

Germann selected as Finney County's first female Commission Chair

The Finney County Commission approved an agreement with the

Kansas Department of Transportation for safety improvements to Old Highway 83 via KDOT's High Risk Rural Road Project at its regular meeting on Tuesday.

Mackenzie Phillips, Finney County Development and Administrative Coordinator, said HRRR project is administered by KDOT through the Highway Safety

Improvement Program, with the intention to improve safety on rural roadways that have a demonstrated history or risk of severe crashes.

"Old Highway 83 is a winding road with many

The Garden City Commission sent a rezoning request for Lost River Addition Phase One back to the Planning Commission at its regular meeting on Tuesday.

The request was to rezone Blocks 1-4 of the Lost River Addition Phase One, aka 1503 Stonebridge Lane, from "R-1" Single Family Residential to "R-C" Condominium-Townhouse District.

Duante Thompson, Neighborhood and Development Services Planner, said the current plat of the addition has vacant lots that range in size from approximately 9,100 square feet to 21,700 square feet.

They were platted for a large,

single-family residential development in 2021, which was established as part of a Reinvestment Housing Incentive District, but the current developer wants to split 12 lots in half to build townhouses, attached, single-family homes, Thompson said. The R-1 zoning district doesn't permit townhomes or lots smaller than 6,000 square feet.

"As a result, the property must be rezoned before the lot splits can be recorded, and any building permits can be issued for townhomes," he said.
