ORDINANCE NO. 2026-01

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF AND THE DISCHARGE OF FIREWORKS WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF LIEBENTHAL, KANSAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF LIEBENTHAL, KANSAS:

SECTION 1.1 GENERAL POLICY.

A. The Governing Body determines that it is in the best interests of the City that it regulates the discharge of fireworks within the City limits of the City of Lieben- thal, Kansas. There are occasions and events where firework discharges are appropriate, and instances when fireworks discharge should be prohibited in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of citizens and their property.

SECTION 1.2. FIREWORKS.

It shall be unlawful for any person, or persons, firm, corporation, or other business entity, association or organization of any kind, whether for profit or otherwise, display for sale, sell, fire or discharge any fireworks in the City as defined by the rules and regulations of the Kansas State Fire Marshal, except as provided in this Ordinance. The term fireworks shall include firecrackers (exceeding one inch in length), Roman candles, sky rockets, pin wheels, cap or toy pistols (except such pistols or any like device designed to discharge paper caps containing not more than 0.25 grains of explosive mixture), canes, bombs, cannons or other

like devices and all classes of fireworks that may be shot into the air or propelled over the ground by explosive discharges or any device using blank cartridges.

SECTION 1.3. SAME, EXCEPTIONS, DISCHARGES

A. It shall be unlawful for any person, or persons, firm, corporation, other business entity, association or organization of any kind, whether for profit or otherwise, including all paid and/or volunteer employees, agents and workers, to fire or discharge any fireworks in the City except between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and midnight on June 27 through July 5. However, the Governing Body may authorize and grant permission for the public display of fireworks for special events by responsible individuals and organizations when such display or displays shall be of such a character and so located, discharged and fired and shall not be a fire hazard or endanger persons or surrounding property. The Governing Body may also expand or restrict the allowable dates and times of discharge. Specifically, when the Rush County, Kansas Commission implements a fire ban because of dry weather conditions, then in such case, all fireworks discharged within the City shall be prohibited until such time as such fire ban has been lifted.

B. It shall be unlawful for any person, or persons, firm, corporation, or other business entity, association, or organization of any kind, whether for profit or otherwise, including all paid and/or volunteer employees, agents and workers, to explode or fire or discharge any fireworks within the fire limits zone or in or

about any motor vehicle, or within ten (10) feet of an animal.

SECTION 1.4. SAME, EXCEPTION; SALE OF FIREWORKS.

It shall be unlawful for any person, or persons, firm, corporation, other business entity, association, or organization of any kind, whether for profit or otherwise, including all paid and/or volunteer employees, agents and workers, to sell, display for sale or offer to sell, within the City, any fireworks except between the hours of 10 a.m. and midnight commencing June 27 through July 5 of each year, unless otherwise authorized by the Governing Body.

SECTION 1.5. BOTTLE ROCKETS PROHIBITED.

It shall be unlawful for any person, or persons, firm, corporation, other business entity, association, or organization of any kind, whether for profit or otherwise, including all paid and/or volunteer employees, agents and workers, to sell, display for sale or offer to sell, fire, or be in possession of bottle rockets, fireworks with metallic streamers, M-80s, silver salutes, cherry bombs or similar fireworks devices within the City.

SECTION 1.6. AUTHORITY OF MAYOR OR DESIGNEE.

The Mayor, any member of the Governing Body, or the Sheriff of Rush County, Kansas and/or his/her designated representative or deputy are authorized to seize and confiscate all fireworks that are used, sold or discharged in violation of this Ordinance. Said fireworks shall be disposed of as may be directed by the Governing Body.

SECTION 1.7.

PENALTIES.

A. The Governing Body determines that the penalty structure should be progressive in nature and should be considered civil in nature. Accordingly, the Governing Body determines that upon a first violation of this Ordinance within a one (1) year period, the violator shall be given a verbal warning. Upon a second violation, the offender shall be assessed a penalty of \$50.00 to be applied to the resident's city utility bill. Upon a third offense, there shall be a \$100.00 penalty imposed. Upon further violations, the Governing Body shall refer the offender to the Rush County, Kansas Sheriff's Office for possible prosecution under applicable Kansas law.

B. That before any penalty is formally assessed or before any referral is made for prosecution, the offender and/or property owner has the right to request a hearing before the Governing Body to present any defense or mitigating circumstances to the offense alleged.

C. The Governing Body, within its sole discretion, has the authority at any hearing regarding violations of this Ordinance to waive or modify any penalties set forth herein.

SECTION 1.8. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and upon its publication one (1) time in the Rush County News, the official City newspaper.

PUBLIC NOTICE

ORDINANCE NO. 2026-02

AN ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO KEEPING CERTAIN DANGEROUS ANIMALS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF LIEBENTHAL, KANSAS, AND REPEALING AND REPLACING ORDINANCE NO. 121.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF LIEBENTHAL, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. ANIMALS. KEEPING PROHIBITED. It shall be unlawful to keep, harbor, own, or in any way possess within the corporate limits of the City of Lieben- thal, Kansas:

(1) Any warm-blooded carnivorous or wild or exotic animal (including but not limited to non-human primates, raccoons, skunks, foxes and wild and exotic cats, but excluding ferrets and small rodents used for laboratory purposes).

(2) Any animal that is venomous.

SECTION 2. FAILURE TO COMPLY. It shall be unlawful for the owner, keeper, or harbinger of any of these animals registered with the City of Lieben- thal, Kansas, to fail to comply with the requirements and conditions set forth in this ordinance.

(1) Any animal found to be the subject of a violation of this ordinance shall be subject to immediate seizure and impoundment, in addition, failure to comply will result in the revocation of the license of such animal resulting in the immediate

removal of the animal from the City.

(2) The City Council shall by a majority vote be authorized to appoint the mayor, any or all council members, or any other person as the enforcement officer for the City of Lieben- thal, Kansas.

(3) Any reasonable costs incurred by the City in seizing, impounding, confining or disposing of any animal prohibited by this ordinance shall be charged against the owner of such an animal and shall be subject to collection by any lawful means.

SECTION 3. VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES.

Any person violating or permitting the violation of any provision of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of up to \$500.00. The enforcement of this act may be by crim-

inal or civil means, nothing herein shall be construed to deny the authority of the City to abate any nuisance.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such a decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

SECTION 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force 10 days after its publication in the official City newspaper.
