CITY OF ERIE ORDINANCE #2026-006

AN ORDINANCE CHANGING THE ZONING DISTRICT CLASSIFICATION OF CERTAIN LANDS LOCATED IN THE CITY OF ERIE, KANSAS, UNDER THE AUTHORITY GRANTED BY THE ZONING REGULATIONS OF THE CITY OF ERIE, KANSAS, AS ORIGINALLY APPROVED BY ORDINANCE NO. 94-750.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ERIE, KANSAS.

SECTION 1. Having received a recommendation from the Erie City Planning Commission, and proper notice having been given and hearing held as provided by law and under authority and subject to the provisions of the Zoning Regulations of the City of Erie, Kansas, as originally approved by Ordinance No. 94-750, the zoning district classification of the lands legally described hereby are changed as follows:
Change of zoning district classification from the R-1 District to the B-2 District.
Legal Description:
Lots 1 and 2, and the North 6 feet of the vacated alley lying adjacent to said lots on the South end thereof, all in Block 30, in the Town, now City of ERIE, as designed on the recorded plat of said town, Neosho County, Kansas
General Description: 611 S. Lincoln St., Erie, KS 66733.

SECTION 2. Upon the taking effect of this Ordinance, the above zoning change shall be entered and shown on the Official Zoning Map(s) as previously adopted by reference, and said map(s) is hereby reincorporated as a part of the Zoning Regulations as amended.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication once in the official city newspaper.

Shirley Lero: My great grandma Barnhart lived on the bottom floor of the house when it was on Butler St. until she could not live by herself. She lived the rest of life with her daughter in California

Sherry Runer: Herb said he remembers her. He said her name was similar to Ola, he thought. Herb said they lived upstairs.

Carolyn Gericke: I remember that house very well. When we were kids we went across the street to the Park and played.

Museum: Thanks to Bert Shackleton (and Ronda Greve Stevenson, his granddaughter) we have these amazing photos of his father Fremont, Shackleton's 1900's home and one of the Shackleton house, the 1904 Courthouse, and also of the original Dr. Milton Emerson and Estella Mulligan Lake's home. All three in one photo.

Later the Nations (Janice Morrison Nation an artist and craft teacher) converted the Lake home into a one story more modern looking home with a garage in the basement.

The Lake (Nation) house is still on Butler and 2nd. The Shackleton home was further south, but not clear down to 3rd and Butler corner. But they did own the rest of that side of the block.

MEM-Erie: Check out the photo of Christmas in 1910 in Erie, Kansas. The Christmas photo was taken in the Fremont Shackleton home by Bert Shackleton, his son, and then Bert hand tinted the photo so those who saw it felt like Christmas. It was Christmas dinner in the Shackleton home. Erie, like most of the country at this period of time - around

1915 - if the people could afford it, the good china and linens, etc. were used on such an important day, making the home look Quite Fancy for the time. BUT, it may also look sparse for our time because we tend to fix everything that was ever thought to be a part of Christmas dinner and a lot of everything.

There is also a photo of Bert about the time his photos were taken. He and a group of Erie High School students created a club lead by Mr. H. J. Walrad, local photographer. Bert and the club at EHS put together a "photo club" and took photos of what was happening around Erie for about four years. We at the museum are so thankful that these photos exist. It is one of the few eras in Erie that we have such great coverage of through Bert's photos.

OH, BTW, Bert and his club invented the "selfie." He would set up the shot including himself, tie a string to the camera shutter and to his shoe. Then, when he was in position, he moved his foot, everyone sat still and the photo was taken. Pretty ingenious.

The colored photos he took were all hand tinted by Bert to show the beautiful colors he saw in any of the photos, especially at Christmas.

David Dalton: I spent a lot of time with Bert. We researched coins together. I bought his 31 Ford as my first car. He was a master furniture finisher and also put leather inside my car.

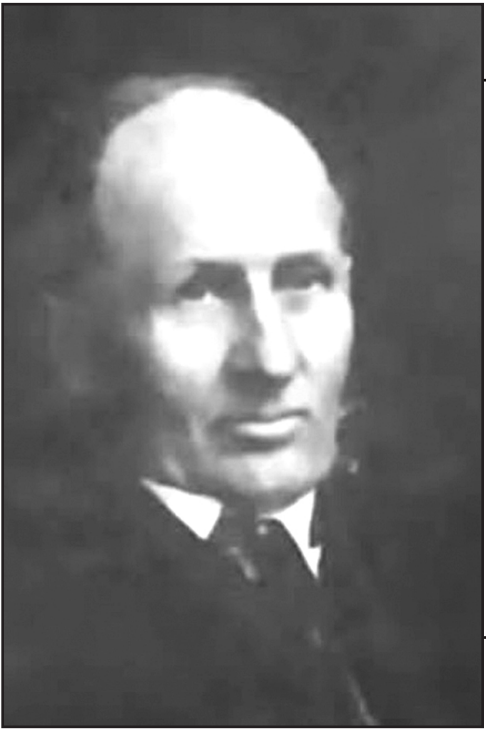

NEOSHO COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. R-26-I
911 DIRECTOR

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Neosho County has determined it to be in the best interests of the citizens of Neosho County that the Neosho County 911 Department be under the direct supervision of the Board of Neosho County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that the Board of Neosho County Commissioners appoint a director of the Neosho County 911 Department.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF NEOSHO COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Tasha Thurman is hereby appointed as director of the Neosho County 911 Department, and shall assume her duties effective as of 30th day of July, 2026.

SECTION 2. The salary for Tasha Thurman shall be set by the Board of Neosho County Commissioners, and shall be modified in the Board's sole discretion.

SECTION 3. The Director of the Neosho County 911 Department shall be under the direct supervision of the Board of Neosho County Commissioners.

SECTION 4. This resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the 30th day of July, 2026.
