

Avs make 14-goal statement as they take 2-0 lead over Wild

DENVER — The Colorado Avalanche are both deep and dynamic, and that unusual combination has the Minnesota Wild searching for answers to their opponent's offensive onslaught. "It's one game at a time," Wild forward Matt Boldy said after the Avalanche's 5-2 win Tuesday night put Minnesota in a 2-0 hole in this second-round series. "It's coming into the next game ready to go. Make our adjustments and be better. You don't win a series with two wins. That's our mindset. You go in, we're going to make adjustments."

Not much has worked for the Wild so far as the Avalanche have pummeled both of their goaltenders, Jesper Wallstedt for eight goals in a 9-6 Game 1 and Filip Gustavsson for four more in Colorado's Game 2 dominance.

The Avalanche's 14 goals are the most in the first two games of a playoff series since the Calgary Flames scored 15 against the Los Angeles Kings in 1988.

Twelve Colorado players have scored so far, an NHL record for the first two games of a series, and 10 Avalanche players have multiple points in the series that resumes Saturday night in St. Paul.

"It's great. I mean, right

now, that's what you need," defenseman Cale Makar said. "You need everybody contributing and we're finding ways to do that. There's a lot of jelling minds right now."

Colorado coach Jared Bednar was asked if he realized he had this much firepower and depth.

"I was hoping we did," Bednar said. "We're getting it now, right, and it doesn't mean we're always going to get the depth scoring. But I think all of our lines and players are capable of producing. Players are going to go through hot streaks, cold streaks, but I also feel like playoff time when everything's on the line, that could

drag the best out of your group at times, and sometimes it can drag the worst out in your group."

After sweeping the Los Angeles Kings, who slowed things down and turned the high-flying Avs into defensive-minded stalwarts, Colorado has flashed its goal-scoring prowess against the Wild.

Scott Wedgewood set the tone for the rebound after allowing a half dozen goals in Game 1. He made 29 saves Tuesday as he improved to 6-0 in his inaugural playoff run as a starter.

"Means we're winning hockey games," Wedgewood said. "I think, statistically, like I said, if we win

9-6, as long as we win, that's all that matters this time of the year. It's not always going to be pretty, like the other night, but just keep winning games, putting pucks on our board and go after the main thing."

Great goaltending. Profound scoring. Speed. Finesse. Physicality. It's all working for Colorado.

"They're a great team," Boldy said. "They play super-fast, super-dynamic. Obviously they have some incredible players. The biggest thing is just staying above them and not giving them those odd-man rushes because obviously their pretty special players make special plays."

Especially Avs captain Gabriel Landeskog and forward Nathan MacKinnon.

Landeskog is looking like his old, pre-injury self of 2022 before a right knee injury robbed him of three seasons. He had a goal and an assist in Game 2. MacKinnon scored a goal and assisted on two others Tuesday.

MacKinnon joined some exclusive company with his third straight three-point playoff game. The only players to accomplish that feat over the last 40 years are Mikko Rantanen (2025), Leon Draisaitl (2022), Joe Pavelski (2010), Joe Sakic (1997) and Dennis Maruk (1986), according to NHL Stats.

TONGANOXIE, EUDORA COMPETE IN 4A INVITATIONALS

Tonganoxie's boys golf team won the Ottawa Invitational on Monday, beating seven other teams to top the invitational.

The Chieftains finished with a 310 team score, which was five strokes better than the runner-up Louisburg team. Eudora finished seventh of the eight teams with a 390 team score.

Lachlan McRae led the

Chieftains by finishing third individually with a 75. Luke McRae finished one stroke behind Lachlan at 76, which put him fourth in the individual leaderboard. Carson Hefel placed seventh by shooting a 79.

William Dohrn took 11th and Cameron Wensel placed 12th after both shot 80 in the invitational. Griffith Dean shot a 91, which put him 26th on the individual leaderboard.

For Eudora, Brayden Gregory shot a 94, which put him 32nd individually. Luke Watts placed right behind him after scoring a 95, and Garrett Moorman made three Cardinals in a row on the leaderboard by shooting a 96. Breaker Amyx shot a 105, which put him 38th.

Eudora golfed in the Maur Hill Mount Academy Invitational Wednesday morning and finished fifth as a team out of 12 schools. The Cardinals finished with a 367 team score, which put them behind Olathe North and ahead of Oskaloosa.

Joey Mastro led the Cardinals with a 12th-place finish by shooting an 83. Watts placed 30th with a 92, and Lash Kueffer shot a 93, which put him 34th. Bryce VanDonge finished with a 99 that put him 43rd, and Moorman shot a 111, which was 56th in the invite.

Bishop Seabury's Jace Hoffman was also golfing at the Maur Hill Mount Academy Invitational and finished eighth individually after he shot a 79 on the day.

PERRY-LECOMPTON FINISHES STRONG IN BACK-TO-BACK INVITATIONALS

The Perry-Lecompton boys golf team competed in the Holton Invitational on Monday and the Humboldt Invitational on Tuesday and finished in the top three in both events.

The Kaws finished third in the Holton Invitational behind Nemaha County and ahead of Jefferson West with a team score of 333.

Toby Wagner led the Kaws on Monday with a third-place finish by shooting a 74 with four birdies. Ethan Tolbert finished fourth with a 77, which was seven strokes above par.

Colton Bahnmaier finished 22nd with an 89, and Logan Herman shot a 93 that put him 24th

individually. Dalton Morey placed 25th with a 95, and Easton Graves shot a 98 that put him 27th.

The Kaws were the runners-up the following day against eight other schools in the Humboldt Invitational. The Kaws finished with a 353 team score, which was one stroke behind first-place Iola.

Wagner led the team again with a third-place finish with an 82 score, and Morey finished eighth by shooting an 89. Herman rounded out the individual top 10 by shooting a 90.

Walker Gray shot a 92, which put him 13th individually. Bahnmaier finished one stroke behind Gray for the 14th spot on the individual leaderboard, and Tolbert shot a 94 for 17th.

Cincinnati, according to the Cincinnati Enquirer. Utah, for what it's worth, already has a private equity deal with Otro Capital, though it's worth noting that by all accounts, the new RedBird deal is not in fact private equity because RedBird does not get any sort of ownership in or control over the league.

In any case, what of Kansas, a school whose chancellor, Douglas Girod,

currently chairs the Big 12's board of directors? Yahoo's Ross Dellenger reported that he "spearheaded" the deal along with Big 12 Commissioner Brett Yormark and quoted Girod as follows: "At the highest level what I hope to get out of this is a really strong partnership that positions our conference well into the future, including for our next media deal by creating increased value."

KU athletic director Travis Goff told the Journal-World in an interview on Wednesday that the athletic department doesn't

know yet if it will opt into the credit line or not.

"I really like that answer and I feel really good about that answer, because we haven't fully assessed it," he said.

The RedBird credit line will reportedly require repayment with an interest rate just below 10%. KU Athletics, for what it's worth, recently extended its own previous \$35 million credit line to \$50 million with a much lower interest rate "based on a 30-day SOFR, which is currently around 3.66%, plus a 1% margin," as the

Journal-World reported in April.

Goff on Wednesday praised Yormark, Girod and the board for "bringing additional opportunities to the table" and described the arrangement as a "no-lose proposition."

"The core part of the deal will drive value for Big 12 membership, I don't have any doubt in my mind," Goff said, referring to the \$12.5 million going to the league.

Many reports on the topic have noted that RedBird holds a stake in Paramount, an alignment

that could potentially be advantageous for the Big 12 in future media rights negotiations.

Goff continued: "Then this other secondary, like, optional thing? Hey, it's just another potential capital partner solution that's already been vetted. And I don't know if we would or we wouldn't."

He said KU doesn't have any urgency around making such a determination. Dellenger reported that schools have a year to decide, and that the belief around the league is that "as few as two and

as many as a half-dozen programs plan to take the money."

Whether KU ultimately counts itself among that number apparently has yet to be determined.

"I just know it's another thing on a short list that could be a tool to tap into if it's deemed responsible financially, and if it's deemed that the capital could be used in a strategic fashion," Goff said. "So that's the real, honest answer, and we don't feel any rush to further assess or to declare yea or nay."
