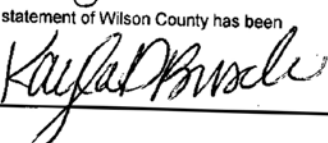

2. Shop around. Not every doc-

tor, hospital, or pharmacy costs the same. Your insurance plan usually has a list of "in-network" doctors
