## Lusker leads Vikings past Udall

Delaney Lusker tallied 17 points coming off the bench as Northeast beat Udall 47-35 Tuesday night in a Class 2A sub-state game in Arma.

The third-seeded Vikings (20-5) advance to play second-seeded Eureka (21-2) in the bracket No. 2 championship game at 7:30 Friday night in Arma.

Eureka coasted past Chase County 53-25 in its second-round game.

The bracket No. 1 championship game matches top-seeded St. Mary's Colgan (22-2) vs. fifth-seeded Dexter/Cedar Vale (13-10) on Friday night at 6.

Lusker, 5-foot-9 junior, made seven field goals and 3-of-6 free throws for her 17 points. She had six points in the second quarter as

the Vikings stretched a 13-5 first-quarter lead to 29-17 at the intermission, and she added 11 points after halftime.

Brooklyn Jackson, 5-7 senior, had eight points in the first quarter and finished with 10.

Lilly Hoffman and Brilee Pellegrini scored 13 points apiece and Addison Robinson had nine for 11th-seeded Udall (8-15). All of the Eagles' field goals

were 3-pointers – three apiece by Pellegrini and Hoffman and two by Robinson.

## PSU qualifies 44 for national meet

A total of 44 Pittsburg State track and field athletes – 24 men, 20 women – have qualified for the NCAA Division II Indoor Championships.

The meet will be held March 13-14 at the Virginia Beach Sports Center in Virginia Beach, Va.

Both PSU teams enter the national meet ranked No. 1 in the national track ratings index. The Gorillas' women's team has been No. 1 all season, and the men's team moved up from third to first in the latest ranking, passing Grand Valley State and Wingate. Both of those teams were ranked No. 1 earlier in the season.

The Gorillas' Griouard Weddington and men's 4x400 relay team enter the national meet as the No. 1 seed.

Weddington tied the all-time NCAA Division II record when he was timed in 6.54 seconds in the 60-meter preliminaries last Saturday at the MIAA Indoor Championships at the Robert W. Plas-

ter Center. Ilias Garcia, who won the final on Sunday, is seeded third at 6.59, and Kemarri Stewart qualified 16th at 6.70.

The 4x400 relay of Amar Williams, Logan Davis, Caden Williams and Nate Watson won their race at the conference meet in 3:07.53.

The Gorillas also have three entries in the 400 meters with Caden Williams third (46.17), Watson fourth (46.29) and Davis ninth (46.55).

Tyrone Jackson (7.79) and Na'Koriyon James (7.87) qualified third and seventh, respectively, in the 60 hurdles.

The distance medley relay team of Jordan Kilonzo, Caden Williams, Eli Gilmore and Dylan Sprecker qualified sixth at 9:41.74. Sprecker also qualified ninth in the mile (4:00.27).

Weddington qualified seventh in the 200 (21.02), and Braylon Thompson is No. 16 (21.15).

The Gorillas have two entries in the heptathlon with Leo Chauchard fourth at 5,347 points and Drew

Wilhite 11th at 5,197.

In the field events, Grayson Smith and Braylon Brown are tied for sixth with a clearance of 17 feet, 2.25 inches.

Jack Haukap is ranked No. 9 in the weight throw (67-10.75). Xavier Byers is 10th in the high jump (7-0.50), and Drake Stapleton is 11th in the shot put (60-0.25) and 17th in the weight throw (66-4.75).

Johnetheon Lockett qualified 12th in the triple jump (49-9.75), and Isaiah Webster is 15th in the long jump (24-2.50) and 16th in the triple jump (49-8.50).

Kevar Williams and William Seitz are alternates on the 4x400 and DMR relays, respectively.

## WOMEN

Jazmine Williamson qualified in three events, ranked No. 2 in the long jump (20-5.25), No. 11 in the high jump (5-8.75) and No. 13 in the triple jump (40-3.25).

Also in the long jump, Blakelee Winn ranks sixth (20-2.50) and Brooklyn Baker is 11th (19-11).

## PSU women finish 14th

Pittsburg State's women's golf team finished in 14th place at the Diefee Ford Lincoln Invitational that ended Tuesday at the Kickingbird Golf Course in Edmond, Okla.

The Gorillas posted a 36-hole total of 643 after rounds of 321-322. They were eight shots behind Missouri Southern and one stroke ahead of Arkansas-Monticello.

Kylee Hopper led PSU with a 17-over-par 157 (76-81) to tie for 32nd place.

PSU's other scores were Kymbree Larance 82-77-159, Katherine Adkins 81-81-162, Genevieve Akers 82-83-165

and Abby Ervin 84-88-172.

Southwestern Oklahoma State claimed the team title for the third consecutive year at 594 (291-303). Central Oklahoma was second with 599, followed by Harding 607 and Nebraska Kearney 612.

Sophia Blake of Redlands Community College won medalist honors at 2-over-par 142 (72-70). Southwestern Oklahoma teammates Maria Velilla and Freya Sala were next at 144 (74-70) and 145 (70-75), respectively.

Next week the Lions play in the Arkansas Collegiate on Monday and Tuesday in El Dorado, Ark.

Dickinson and Renn wrapped up their high school careers. The Lancers finished their season 12-13.

"They're really good and we knew that," Coach Sanders said about Colgan. "We came in and thought if we could shorten the game and not having a shot clock ... we didn't do terrible with it. We got sped up two or three possessions early and fell behind. Down seven at the end of the quarter, I thought that was a decent quarter. We were able to get some penetration against their man.

"Kendyl going down really hurt us and losing Zakiyyah to fouls in the third quarter and Camryn also being in foul trouble tonight. They're really good and there's a reason they're ranked as high as they are. They've beaten a lot of teams by quite a wide margin. One thing, I never felt like we stopped playing.

The girls continued to compete. Like I told them, when you play good people and you compete, that's how you get better.

"Hopefully, we can really improve this summer. I think we got better tonight and we need to get better this summer. We've got a lot of girls coming back who got a lot of experience this year, so that will be good because we lost a lot coming into this year.
