Ordinance No. 2026-01

AN ORDINANCE DEFINING AND PROVIDING FOR THE APPROPRIATE LICENSING, CARE, TREATMENT, AND CONFINEMENT OF DOGS, AND IF NECESSARY, APPROPRIATE REQUIREMENTS, PENALTIES, AND BANS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ARCADIA, KANSAS:

The Code of the City of Arcadia, Kansas is hereby amended to add the following:

SECTION 1. Dog Licensing. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to own, keep, or harbor any dog within the corporate limits of the City of Arcadia without first having paid the annual dog licensing fee to the City:

- a. \$5.00 on a male or spayed female dog per year.
- b. \$10.00 on a unspayed female dog per year.

The annual dog license shall be paid on a calendar year basis beginning with calendar year 2026.

SECTION 2. License Fee to be Collected by the City Clerk. Said annual license tax shall be paid to the City Clerk, during regular business hours, who shall keep a record thereof and issue a receipt thereof and issue a receipt therefore stating the date of payment, description of dog and the person paying such tax. Proof of rabies vaccination is required at time of licensing.

SECTION 3. Running at Large

- a. It shall be unlawful for the owner, keeper, harbinger or possessor of any dog to allow or permit a dog to run at large in, on or upon any public alley, street, sidewalk, park or thoroughfare or in, on or upon any premises except the premises of the person who owns, keeps, harbors or possesses such dog. The factual determination that the dog was running at large shall be prima facie evidence of violation of this Section.
- b. A dog shall be deemed to run at large when it is not under the physical control of the person who owns, keeps, harbors or possesses the dog by a leash or other similar device which is adequate to control the dog. Under no circumstances shall voice control be considered adequate or physical control.

SECTION 4. Impoundment; record; notice; redemption; minimum fee.

- a. Any dog found in violation of the provisions of Section 1 shall be subject to immediate seizure and impoundment by the city.
- b. A record of all dogs impounded shall be kept by the city containing the following information: color, sex, weight, height, identifying marks, registration number (if any) and the date of impoundment.
- c. If the dog impounded has a current registration tag attached to its collar or if the impounding officer knows the identity of the dog's owner, the owner of such dog, as shown by the records of the city clerk shall be notified in writing as soon as possible or at least 24 hours before such dog is disposed of by destruction or sale. If, at the end of five days the city clerk has been unable to locate the owner, or the owner, upon having been located, refuses to claim or redeem said dog, then the dog may be sold, euthanized or otherwise disposed of.
- d. If at any time before the sale or destruction of any dog impounded under the provisions of this article, the owner of an impounded dog does appear and redeem the dog, it shall be turned over to the person claiming it upon payment of any impoundment fees or penalties plus the actual costs of impoundment, and upon compliance with the registration provisions of this article. This subsection shall not apply to any dog alleged as being vicious or suspected of rabies.
- e. Any dog impounded may not be released without a current rabies vaccination.
- f. Impoundment hereunder shall not preclude any court from imposing and executing any fine which might otherwise be levied under this article for violation of any of the provisions thereof; nor shall impoundment be a defense in any prosecution commenced hereunder.
- g. The redemption of any dog impounded for a violation of any provision of this chapter shall be prima facie evidence of the violation of such proviso by the person redeeming the dog.

SECTION 5. Disposition of Unclaimed Dogs. If any dog is not redeemed by its owner or harbinger within the time allowed for redemption as specified in Section 2(c) of this Ordinance, the animal control officer, any authorized law enforcement officer, any authorized veterinarian or any duly authorized pound personnel may destroy such dog or sell the same for the costs of impoundment and keeping, plus any registration fee due for the current year.

SECTION 6. Failure to Comply and Penalties. Any person violating or permitting the violation of any provision of this ordinance shall upon conviction in Municipal Court be fined a sum not less than \$125.00 and not more than \$175.00 for the first offense, a sum not less than \$200.00 and not more than \$275.00 for the second offense, and a sum not less than \$300.00 and not more than \$400.00 for the third and subsequent offense(s). Each day that a violation of this Ordinance continues may be deemed a separate offense, to be determined by the Municipal Court Judge on a case-by-case basis. In addition to the foregoing penalties, any person who violates this ordinance shall pay all expenses, including shelter, food, handling, and veterinary care, in addition to any court costs, necessitated by the enforcement of this Ordinance.

Section 7. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

Section 8. Repeal. All ordinances and or parts of ordinances, specifically Ordinance No. 2023-2 and 2004-10, that are in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 9. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.
