form provided by the city clerk, and a complete application shall be submitted to the city clerk, accompanied by the appropriate fees. The application form shall obtain the information necessary to conduct a criminal background check on each person listed as a solicitor on the application to ensure compliance with this section.

(b) No license shall be issued under this chapter to any person who:

(1) Is required to register pursuant to the Kansas Offender Registration Act, K.S.A. 22-4901 et seq., or pursuant to a regular registration act of any state; or

(2) Has been convicted in the past five (5) years of a felony; or

(3) Has been convicted in the past three (3) years of a misdemeanor or ordinance violation involving force, violence, deceit, or fraud; or

(4) Has been convicted of any law regulating the act of soliciting within the past five years.

(c) The fees for the license and criminal background checks shall be as prescribed in section 5-206.

(d) The solicitor, canvasser or peddler shall have the license issued to him or her by the City Clerk in their possession and on their person at all times that he or she is actively canvassing, soliciting or peddling within the City of Carbondale.

SECTION 2. Section 5-211 of the Code of the City of Carbondale is hereby amended to provide as follows:

Section 5-211. Unlawful acts.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any peddler, canvasser, or solicitor:

(1) To solicit within the city between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. the following morning.

(2) To enter upon the private premises of any dwelling when the premises are posted with a sign stating "No Peddling," "No Solicitations" or any other words to such effect.

(3) To solicit upon, or to refuse to leave, any premises after having been asked by the owner or occupant thereof to leave the premises.

(4) To fail to have the license issued to him or her by the City Clerk in their possession and on their person at all times that he or she is actively canvassing, soliciting or peddling within the City of Carbondale.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any solicitor to make false or fraudulent statements concerning the quality or nature of the solicitor's goods, wares, merchandise, food, or services for the purpose of inducing another to purchase the same.

(c) Any individual convicted of engaging in any activities defined in Section 5-201 without a then having an unrevoked and unexpired license therefor as required by Section 5-202 or any of the unlawful acts hereinabove listed, shall upon a first conviction be fined a minimum of \$150.00 and up to \$1,000.00 and/or up to 30 days in the county jail, and shall upon a second or subsequent conviction be fined a minimum of \$500.00 and up to \$2,500.00 and/or up to six (6) months in the county jail.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

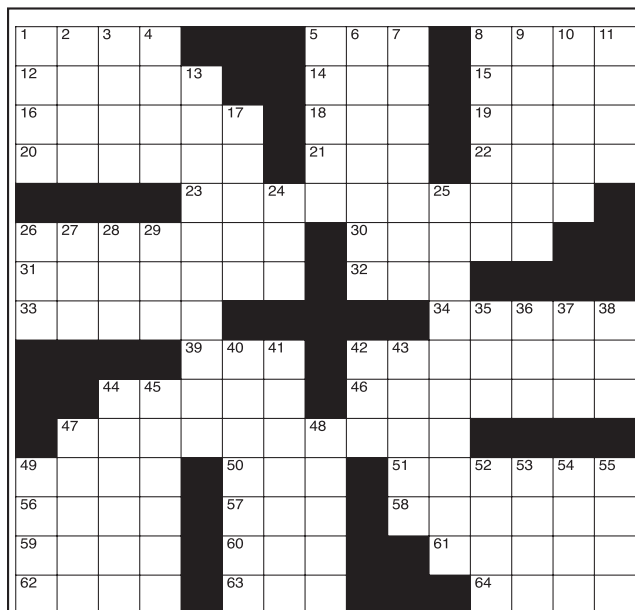
